

LIFE GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

May 3rd

- The sermon emphasized that Philip's extraordinary experience began with very ordinary obedience.
 - **What are some examples of "ordinary" faithfulness or trust that often get overlooked, but may actually shape us deeply over time?**
- The sermon suggested that obedience is not mainly about behavior modification, but about learning to experience and abide in the love of God.
 - **How does that perspective differ from the way obedience is often talked about or understood?**
 - **What part of that idea stood out to you?**
- The Ethiopian eunuch's question — "What would keep me from being baptized?" — sits at the center of the story.
 - **Why do you think that question carries so much emotional weight?**
 - **What does the response of Philip and the Spirit reveal about the heart of God's kingdom, and are ways that can be reflect in us as kingdom citizens?**
- One of the themes in the message was that the kingdom of God and the Spirit of God are already present and active in places we might not expect.
 - **How might that change the way we think about our workplaces, neighborhoods, relationships, or even difficult environments?**
- The early followers of Jesus probably could not imagine how far the gospel would spread, yet we are living proof of that story continuing.
 - **What helps you remember that your faith is part of a much bigger story?**
 - **How might the perspective what we live beyond "the ends of the earth" affect the way we think about our daily lives?**
