

LIFE GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

October 12th

1. Devoted to the Beauty of Jesus

The first believers weren't driven by duty but by awe—they couldn't stop learning about Jesus because they had seen His beauty.

- What helps you read Scripture as a living encounter with Jesus instead of just information? What small habit might help you keep that posture this week?

- **Key Question:** Share a story or aspect of Jesus that has recently reminded you how beautiful He is — what about it moves you?

2. True Fellowship — Koinonia

The fellowship of the early church was more than friendliness; it was a shared life of generosity, prayer, and partnership in mission.

- Where have you experienced that kind of partnership — where doing something with others became something deeper?
- **Key Question:** If that kind of deeper community were to grow around you, what small step could you take to help it happen? What could you do to turn ordinary connections into something deeper?

3. The Table as Sacred Space

Meals became a tangible expression of unity and belonging in the early church. The table wasn't just about food—it was about family.

- Think of a meal that deepened a relationship or changed you. What made it meaningful, and how could we use shared meals to form community in a similar way?

4. Prayer that Draws Us Together

Their prayers weren't performances but honest expressions of shared dependence and love before God.

- What makes it difficult—or freeing—for you to pray honestly with others?
- **Key Questions:** How could our group grow in praying together with openness, dependence, and Spirit-led sincerity?

5. Open-Handed Generosity

What fears or hesitations surface when you think about sharing your needs and/or your blessings?

What's one small, concrete way you could practice generosity this week?

6. The Beauty of Our Life Together

Key Question: When people outside our church observe our life together, what do you hope they notice most?

Key Question: What kind of community would make the good news of the kingdom look beautiful in our town?
