

LIFE GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

May 3rd

- The message explored the idea that the presence of God is no longer centered in a building, but among God's people.
 - **What stood out to you most about that idea? How might it change the way we think about church, worship, or everyday life?**
- One of the recurring themes in Acts 1–7 is that ordinary believers became participants in God's work through the Holy Spirit.
 - **Where do you see that happening in the early church? What encourages or challenges you about that picture of community?**
- The sermon highlighted several "signs" of a Spirit-filled community: prayer, generosity, healing, forgiveness, caring for the overlooked, and sharing life together.
 - **Which of those feels especially important or meaningful to you right now? Why?**
- In Acts 6, the early church faced conflict when some widows were being overlooked, and the community responded by empowering the offended minority to help lead toward a solution.
 - **What do you notice or appreciate about the way the early church handled that conflict? What wisdom might churches or communities today learn from that story?**
- Near the end of the message, there was a strong emphasis on Grace being "a house of healing and rest."
 - **What do you think makes a community feel safe, healing, or restful for people? Have you experienced moments where a church or community embodied that well?**
