## 1. Familiarity with Jesus

Gary suggests the real danger isn't unbelief, but becoming so familiar with Jesus that we stop seeing Him clearly.

Where do you think familiarity—whether in faith, relationships, or everyday life—can cause us to overlook what really matters?

If it feels natural, where have you seen that dynamic show up in your own life?

## 2. The Posture of Humility (Philippians 2)

Gary highlights Jesus' posture of laying down status and taking the role of a servant.

Where do you see humility most clearly modeled in the world around you, or where does it seem most absent?

What makes that kind of humility compelling... or challenging?

## 3. What We Expect from God

Gary challenges the idea that faith is mainly about what God can do for us.

What do you think people today most often expect from God?

How might that shape the way we approach faith or prayer?

## 4. Costly Humility

The message points toward a kind of humility that actually costs something.

What are some everyday situations where choosing humility might come at a cost?

What makes those moments difficult to navigate?

## 5. Trust and Surrender

Gary ends with the idea that surrender to Jesus is ultimately unavoidable, yet we often resist it.

Why do you think people tend to resist giving up control or trusting someone else?

When or where does trust feel easy in everyday life? Where does it feel hard?

## 6. Eastertide

We have talked about the fact that Easter is more than a one-day event. Easter is a 50-day period of celebration.

When you think about Easter growing up or in past seasons of life, what stands out most—traditions, memories, or how it was (or wasn't) celebrated?

What might it look like to treat Easter as a full season rather than just a day? What are some simple or meaningful ways people could carry the joy and celebration of Easter into everyday life?
