

LIFE GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

September 14th

Awakened

1. In Acts 1:1–3, Luke emphasizes that Jesus gave “many convincing proofs” of His resurrection. Why do you think the disciples (and later readers like Theophilus) needed those repeated proofs?
2. How does this picture of Jesus meeting His disciples’ doubts with patience and evidence challenge the idea that “real faith is blind”?
3. **Key Question:** What “alarm clocks” has God used in your life—moments where He wouldn’t let you hit snooze—so that you’d be awakened to His reality?

Unbounded

1. What presuppositions or boundaries do we sometimes bring into our own faith—about who God can reach, how He should act, or what His kingdom should look like?
2. **Key Question:** If the gospel truly knows no boundaries, who or what have you quietly placed “outside” God’s reach? How might the Spirit be inviting you to reconsider that?

Captivated

1. Luke ties the ascension to Daniel 7’s vision of the Son of Man enthroned in glory. What does it mean for your daily life that Jesus already reigns—not just one day in the future, but right now?
2. **Key Questions:** The message reminded us: Jesus doesn’t guilt His people into mission; He captivates them with His glory. What rhythms/ practices/ habits helps you keep your eyes fixed on the beauty of Christ?
3. How might longing for the King Himself (not just doing tasks for the kingdom) reshape your faith and witness?
4. **Key Question:** Where in your life do you feel God calling you to “bear witness” this week—not to make Him Lord, but to declare that He already is?
