 - b. What do you think about this promise in V3... Does it apply to all or just the Jews? If just the Jews, then why did Paul say it here? If it applies to all, how might we interpret it for ourselves today in this day and age?
4. What are some ways parents might be provoking to their children?
 - a. In your opinion is the father more likely to do so? Why or why not?
 - b. If you have children, have you ever provoked them to anger? ... I bet the answer is yes, so what did you do about it? Have you asked for forgiveness from them?
