1. How does seeing the Bible as one unified story change the way you read the Old Testament?
2. Why is it essential that Jesus is both fully God and fully man? What would be lost if either were untrue?
3. In what areas of your life do you most need the comfort of knowing Christ understands human struggle firsthand?
4. What does it communicate about God's character that He chooses to dwell with His people rather than remain distant?
5. Where do you most clearly see Christ's glory today — in Scripture, in the cross, in changed lives, somewhere else?
6. Which do you tend to emphasize more in your own relationships — grace or truth? Why? What would it look like to reflect Christ's balance?
7. What does Christ-centered humility look like in your season of life? Where is it hardest for you to step out of the spotlight?
8. Can you identify specific "layers" of grace God has given you over time — forgiveness, growth, provision, correction, restoration?
9. How does understanding the law as preparation for Christ deepen your appreciation for the gospel?
10. If someone asked you what God is like, how would you answer from the life of Jesus? What aspects of His character stand out most to you?
