Appendix: The Deacons Wife

- 1. The author states that, "how people view the office of deacon will be a significant factor in interpreting who the *gynaikes* of verse 11 are." Explain how the authors view of the identity and role of the deacon affects his interpretation of the women of verse 11.
- 2. Explain the problem that the Greek word *gynaikes* and 1 Timothy 3.11 creates for the Bible translator or commentator. How does your Bible handle the translation of this term? Do you agree or disagree with your Bible translation?
- 3. In verse 11, Paul uses the Greek word for wives rather than a more specific title, for women deacons. As best as you can, explain why the author sees this as a problem.
- 4. All the arguments the author uses can be answered by counter arguments. How would you refute the authors interpretation of verse 11?
- 5. Explain the point of the argument of the placement of *gynaikes* in the midst of male deacons. How would you review the authors point?
- 6. Reading in the section, "the omission of any material or family requirements" see page is 161-162 in the text. What is the point of the writers argument and why does he make a big point of this argument? How would you refute this argument?
- 7. In what ways are the five qualifications for the male deacons and the four qualifications for the women similar and dissimilar? List them.
- 8. How would you refute those who argue that the similar qualifications of the women in verse 11 with the male deacons in versus 8-10 demonstrate that they are women deacons?
- 9. Another point of contention is the interpretation of Romans 16.1. Phoebe is called a *diakonos*.
 - a. What problems do all interpreters face when trying to interpret the term *diakonos* in Romans 16.1?
 - b. What is your suggestion for solving this interpretive problem?
- 10. One key criticism of the wives of the deacons view is the omission of the pronoun (their) or the article (the) this is a legitimate criticism.
 - a. How does the author answer this objection?
 - b. Do you think the author has adequately answered this criticism? Explain.
- 11. Another objection to the wives of the deacons view claims that the continent and particularly the grammatical structure of the passage requires that the woman a verse 11 to be equally office holders with the male deacons.
 - a. How does the author answer the above objection?
 - b. Do you think the author has adequately answered this objection? Explain.
- 12. A final objection asks, if the deacons wives must be of a certain godly character, should not such requirements be even more necessary for the elders wives? Some argue that the absence of a list of specific qualifications for the elders wives in versus 2-7 is another key indicator that verse 11 refers to women deacons.
 - a. How does the author answer this objection?
 - b. Do you think the author has adequately answered this objection? Explain.

- 13. What do you think are the two strongest arguments the author presents in the appendix in favor of the wives of the deacons view? Explain your answer.
- 14. What do you think is the strongest objection to the wives of the deacons view? Explain your answer.
