

Group Questions

1. In John 1:1–2, what does John clearly teach about who Jesus is? Why is each phrase (“was,” “with God,” “was God”) important?
2. Why do you think John begins his Gospel with “In the beginning”? What connection is he making to Genesis 1?
3. According to John 1:3–4, what is Jesus’ relationship to creation and life?
4. John 1:5 says the darkness has not overcome the light. What kinds of “darkness” do you think John has in mind?
5. In John 20:30–31, what does John explicitly say is his purpose for writing? What stands out to you about that purpose?
6. Why is it essential that Jesus is fully God and not merely a great teacher or prophet? How would your faith change if He were less than God?
7. What does it mean to “believe” in John’s Gospel? How is biblical belief different from simply agreeing with facts?
8. Where do you currently see “darkness” in your life (fear, doubt, sin, discouragement)? How does the truth that the Light cannot be overcome speak into that?
9. If eternal life comes through believing in Jesus (John 20:31), how confident are you in your own trust in Him? What strengthens or challenges that confidence?
10. Who in your life needs to hear this message of the Light and Life found in Christ? How can you intentionally point them to Him this week?
