2. How does the Fall in Genesis 3:17–19 affect the way we experience work today?
3. Colossians 3:23–24 says to work “as unto the Lord.” What does that practically look like in your job or daily tasks?
4. What’s the difference between working for money and working for God’s glory?
5. How can someone without a traditional job (e.g., student, retired, stay-at-home parent) apply this theology of work?
6. Share a time when work felt frustrating or fruitless. How might seeing work as worship have helped in that moment?
7. How does your attitude at work influence your witness to coworkers or family?
8. What does it mean to be “called” to your current role? How can you discern God’s calling in your career?
9. Read Ephesians 2:10. How does this verse shape your view of what you do Monday–Saturday?
10. What is one specific way you can honor God more in your work this week?
