



## Group Questions

1. In the introduction of the sermon, Jesus is described as kneeling in the dust instead of immediately responding. Why do you think His patience and silence were so powerful in this moment?
2. Which of Jesus' teachings from Point I stands out most to you personally: Why?
3. The religious leaders used the woman as a weapon to trap Jesus. Have you ever seen religion or morality used without mercy or compassion? How should Christians respond differently?
4. Why is it important that Jesus did not ignore or minimize the woman's sin, even while offering her grace and forgiveness?
5. Jesus said, "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone." How does this challenge the way we often judge others?
6. The sermon emphasized that adultery (and sin in general) affects more than just the individual. Which of the five areas impacted by sin stood out to you most, and why?
7. The accusers quietly walked away one by one. What role does conscience play in bringing conviction and humility into our lives?
8. Jesus told the woman, "Neither do I condemn you; go, and from now on sin no more." Why is the order of those statements so important?
9. Are there areas in your life where you struggle more with: How does this passage speak into that struggle?
10. Jesus ends the passage by saying, "I am the light of the world." What does it practically look like to "walk in the light" this week?
