LIVING FREE II – THE CHOICE IS



[Luke 4:18-19]

18 "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me (the Messiah),
Because He has anointed Me to preach the good news to the
poor. He has sent Me to announce release (pardon, forgiveness)
to the captives, And recovery of sight to the blind, To set free
those who are oppressed (downtrodden, bruised, crushed by
tragedy),

19 to proclaim the favorable year of the Lord [the day when salvation and the favor of God abound greatly]......

[Luke 4:20-21]

20 Then He rolled up the scroll [having stopped in the middle of the verse], gave it back to the attendant and sat down [to teach]; and the eyes of all those in the synagogue were [attentively] fixed on Him.

21 He began speaking to them: "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing and in your presence." Amp

(John 8:36), "So if the Son makes you free, then you are unquestionably free." AMP

The blood of Jesus provides the only solution to our greatest problem.....

[Ps. 51:5], "I was brought forth in [a state of] wickedness; In sin my mother conceived me [and from my beginning I, too, was sinful]." Amp

Apart from the redeeming power of the blood of Jesus Christ, we were doomed!

- o [Rom. 5:8], "But God clearly shows and proves His own love for us, by the fact that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." AMP
- o Our biggest problem solved!

[Deut. 30:19,20]

19 I call heaven and earth as witnesses against you today, that I have set before you life and death, the blessing and the curse; therefore, you shall choose life in order that you may live, you and your descendants,

20 by loving the Lord your God, by obeying His voice, and by holding closely to Him; for He is your life [your good life, your abundant life, your fulfillment] and the length of your days, that you may live in the land which the Lord promised (swore) to give to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob." Amp

LIVING FREE - THE FREEDOM JESUS PROMISES: (Luke 4:18-19)

"18 The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me (the Messiah), Because He has anointed Me to preach the good news to the poor. He has sent Me to announce release (pardon, forgiveness) to the captives, And recovery of sight to the blind, To set free those who are oppressed (downtrodden, bruised, crushed by tragedy)......

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[vss. 20-21], 20 Then He rolled up the scroll [having stopped in the middle of the verse], gave it back to the attendant and sat down [to teach]; and the eyes of all those in the synagogue were [attentively] fixed on Him.

21 He began speaking to them: "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing and in your presence." Amp

[Luke 24:44-49]

44 Then He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you, everything which has been written about Me in the Law of Moses and the [writings of the] Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled."

45 Then He opened their minds to [help them] understand the Scriptures,

46 and said, "And so it is written, that the Christ (the Messiah, the Anointed) would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day....

47 and that repentance [necessary] for forgiveness of sins would be preached in His name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem.

48 You are witnesses of these things.

49 Listen carefully: I am sending the Promise of My Father [the Holy Spirit] upon you; but you are to remain in the city [of Jerusalem] until you are clothed (fully equipped) with power from on high." Amp

- A. To whom is Christ sent?
- "To the poor." "To the captives." "To the blind." To "those who are oppressed."
- B. So now the question becomes: Do I qualify? Do I fit these categories? Poor, captive, blind, oppressed?

1. By nature we are poor.

[Job 1:21], Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: the Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord.

[Mat. 5:3], "Blessed [spiritually prosperous, happy, to be admired] are the poor in spirit [those devoid of spiritual arrogance, those who regard themselves as insignificant], for theirs is the kingdom of heaven [both now and forever].." Amp

2. The captives - That is our condition by nature!!! In prison, and unable to free ourselves.

(Rom. 7:14-25), 14 We know that the Law is spiritual, but I am a creature of the flesh [worldly, self-reliant—carnal and unspiritual], sold into slavery to sin [and serving under its control].

15 For I do not understand my own actions [I am baffled and bewildered by them]. I do not practice what I want to do, but I am doing the very thing I hate [and yielding to my human nature, my worldliness—my sinful capacity]....

16 Now if I habitually do what I do not want to do, [that means] I agree with the Law, confessing that it is good (morally excellent).

17 So now [if that is the case, then] it is no longer I who do it [the disobedient thing which I despise], but the sin [nature] which lives in me.

18 For I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my flesh [my human nature, my worldliness—my sinful capacity]. For the willingness [to do good] is present in me, but the doing of good is not....

20 But if I am doing the very thing I do not want to do, I am no longer the one doing it [that is, it is not me that acts], but the sin [nature] which lives in me.

21 So I find it to be the law [of my inner self], that evil is present in me, the one who wants to do good.

22 For I joyfully delight in the law of God in my inner self [with my new nature],

23 but I see a different law and rule of action in the members of my body [in its appetites and desires], waging war against the law of my mind and subduing me and making me a prisoner of the law of sin which is within my members.

24 Wretched and miserable man that I am! Who will [rescue me and] set me free from this body of death [this corrupt, mortal existence]?

25 Thanks be to God [for my deliverance] through Jesus Christ our Lord!" Amp

- 3. The blind Without the enlightenment/power of the Holy Spirit, you and I are spiritually blind.
- 4. The oppressed Sin presses hard against us every day. The devil won't leave us alone.

[Rom. 8:35-39], 35 Who shall ever separate us from the love of Christ? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?

36 Just as it is written and forever remains written, "FOR YOUR SAKE WE ARE PUT TO DEATH ALL DAY LONG; WE ARE REGARDED AS SHEEP FOR THE SLAUGHTER."

37 Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors and gain an overwhelming victory through Him who loved us [so much that He died for us].

38 For I am convinced [and continue to be convinced—beyond any doubt] that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present and threatening, nor things to come, nor powers,

39 nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the [unlimited] love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." Amp

[Deut. 30:19,20]

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
