When I was a little girl, Palm Sunday and Holy Week puzzled me. The more I learned in Sunday School about the events of those days, the more questions I had. Why did Jesus' ride into town on a donkey? It seemed an inappropriate form of transportation for the Son of God. I thought that maybe a gorgeous Arabian would have been a better choice, but Jesus chose a donkey. Why did Jesus allow that traitor, Judas, to dine with the rest of the Apostles at the Last Supper? Jesus knew that Judas was going to betray Him very shortly, and yet Jesus dines with him and washed his feet. I think that it would make more sense for Jesus to have politely asked Judas to sit this one out, so to speak. Jesus chose to include Judas. Why did Pontius Pilate order Jesus to be crucified, when by his own words, he could find no fault with him? Jesus chose not to plead for His life with Pilate. Why did the crowd scream out for Jesus' crucifixion? I think that this type of behavior deserves severe punishment.
