For several years now, I have occasionally ordered items from an online art company. I became interested initially when they advertised several cute paintings of cocker spaniels, as we have owned several over the years. So, I was casually looking through their site the other day when I came upon a lovely copy of the Lord's Prayer, written in gold ink in a calligraphy style, and framed. Now each piece of art has a notice underneath it which gives the title of the piece, the painter or photographer or author, followed by information regarding the specific type of art.
