Revelation 15:2 (KJV)

- ² And I saw as it were a sea of glass mingled with fire: and them that had gotten the victory over the beast, and over his image, and over his mark, *and* over the number of his name, stand on the sea of glass, having the harps of God.
 - 3. He hears the songs sung in heaven.
- 7. John sees the temple of tabernacle.
 - a. There are four things we should be made aware of about this temple of tabernacle.
 - b. First He sees the temple of the tabernacle of testimony in heaven was open Revelation 15:5 (KJV)
- ⁵ And after that I looked, and, behold, the temple of the tabernacle of the testimony in heaven was opened:
 - 1. The temple is referred to fifteen times in the book of revelation.
 - a. What is this temple of the tabernacle?
 - b. It is the innermost part of the sanctuary.
 - 1. It is symbolic of both tabernacles of the Old Testament.
 - a. The one God showed Moses.

Exodus 25:9 (KJV)

- ⁹ According to all that I shew thee, *after* the pattern of the tabernacle, and the pattern of all the instruments thereof, even so shall ye make *it*.
 - b. The one Salmon built somewhere between the 10th and 6th century.
 - 2. It is symbolic of the most Holy of Holies
 - a. It is the Most holy place where the art was kept in the earthly tabernacles.
 - b. It is symbolic of the presence of God.
 - 3. Here it is where God Himself is.
 - 4. Here in this setting, it is symbolic of the judgments of God.
 - a. The judgments themselves will come from
 - 1. The throne of God
 - 2. The presence of God
 - 3. The heart of God
 - 5. God will send fourth the final judgments upon.
 - a. The earth
 - b. The antichrist and false prophet
 - c. The wick of this earth from the very throne room of God.

- c. Secondly It is the place that all these angels have been dispatched from
 - 1. All the plagues have been dispatched
 - 2. All the judgements have been dispatched.
 - 3. All the seals been broken
 - 4. All the trumpets have been sounded
 - 5. All the Bowls will be sent fourth from the throne of God.
- d. Thirdly The open door When Jesus died upon the cross the vail was rent –(torn)- from top to bottom

Matthew 27:51 (KJV)

And, behold, the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom; and the earth did quake, and the rocks rent;

Matthew 27:51 (NKJV)

- ⁵¹ Then, behold, the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom; and the earth quaked, and the rocks were split,
 - 1. Meaning the separation between man and God was finished.
 - 2. The veil in the Old Testament tabernacle was approx. 60 feet long and 30 feet wide and made of many different materials (multitude layers of fine linen woven tightly together).

- 3. Its was symbolic of the separation of God from man and himself because of their sin.
- 4. Jesus's death on the cross opened the door-(or veil) between man and God and it stands open even today.

Revelation 15:5 (NKJV)

- ⁵ After these things I looked, and behold, the temple of the tabernacle of the testimony in heaven was opened.
 - a. The word open can mean reversal meaning at one time the Veil-(or door) was closed or not opened.
 - b. Jesus said I Am the door Meaning I am the opening between God And man.
