 - b. Satan tried to tempt Him. Matt. 4:1-16
 - c. The Scribes accused Him. Luke 23:10
 - d. The high priest led the people to crucify Him. Matt. 27: 20
 - e. So Satan stands ready to devour the Child of the women one more time.

Exodus 20:13 (KJV)

 - 1. Cain killed Abel because he was angry at God first.

Revelation 12:5 (KJV)

- ⁵ And she brought forth a man child, who was to rule all nations with a rod of iron: and her child was caught up unto God, and *to* his throne.
 - a. This is referring to an event that has happened.
 - 1. The birth of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Matt. 2:1-23

2. But this male child came as a lamb.

John 1:34-36 (KJV)

- And I saw, and bare record that this is the Son of God. ³⁵ Again the next day after John stood, and two of his disciples; ³⁶ And looking upon Jesus as he walked, he saith, Behold the Lamb of God!
- 3. For the soul purpose to be crucified as a perfect sacrifice for mankind. Heb. 9:11-28 John 1:29 (KJV)
- ²⁹ The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.
- b. But this male child is coming to be something else or more.

Revelation 5:5 (NKJV)

- ⁵ But one of the elders said to me, "Do not weep. Behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has prevailed to open the scroll and to loose its seven seals."
 - 1. Scripture says He is coming as a lion with a rod of Iron.

Revelation 12:5 (NKJV)

- ⁵ She bore a male Child who was to rule all nations with a rod of iron. And her Child was caught up to God and His throne.
 - 2. The word rod is the Greek word 4464 which means Sceptre –(Scepter) or staff
 - a. It is used to smite or slap as if with the palm of one's hand.

Isaiah 9:4 (NKJV)

- ⁴ For You have broken the yoke of his burden And the staff of his shoulder, The rod of his oppressor, As in the day of Midian.
 - 3. The word staff in the Hebrew means Rod or Sceptre for the use of Chastising or for ruling.
 - b. The word Scepter the Hebrew 7626 which means
 - 1. To strike 2. Ruling 3. Correction 4. Staff or rod.

Numbers 24:17 (KJV)

- ¹⁷ I shall see him, but not now: I shall behold him, but not nigh: there shall come a Star out of Jacob, and a Sceptre shall rise out of Israel, and shall smite the corners of Moab, and destroy all the children of Sheth.
 - 4. The word iron is the Greek word 4603 which means made of iron
 - a. Scripture says, He is coming to dash to pieces evil.

Psalm 2:9 (KJV)

⁹ Thou shalt break them with a rod of iron; thou shalt dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel.

⁹ Now when He had spoken these things, while they watched, He was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight. ¹⁰ And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel, ¹¹ who also said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This *same* Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven."

Revelation 12:6 (NKJV)

- ⁶ Then the woman fled into the wilderness, where she has a place prepared by God, that they should feed her there one thousand two hundred and sixty days.
 - a. Again is a something that is happening rather than something that has happened.
 - b. It should be seen as a place of refuge rather than a desert place.
 - c. Its a place of refuge for those Jews who are seeking and looking for the return of Christ.
- d. It is a place for the remnant of which the bible speaks of through out scripture.
 - 1. But also it is speaking of a place of refuge for the believing Jews only. Isiaha 66:17-24 Micah 4:6-13 -
- 15. The place is called Petra.
 - a. Located in Jordan or the valley of Moses.
 - b. Approx 150 south of Jerusalem
 - c. It's a approx. one-mile journey through a narrow mountain path, to the entrance of Petra
 - d. Jesus used the word Petra when He said to Peter.

Matthew 16:18 (KJV)

- ¹⁸ And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.
 - e. It is though to be the escaping place for all believing Jews at the beginning and through-out the antichrist reign.
- 16. This male child is returning as a lion.
 - a. The lion of Judah.

Revelation 5:5 (KJV)

- ⁵ And one of the elders saith unto me, Weep not: behold, the Lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of David, hath prevailed to open the book, and to loose the seven seals thereof.
