5. The Hebrew word for Satan is Accuser?

Zechariah 3:1 (NKJV)

¹ Then he showed me Joshua the high priest standing before the Angel of the LORD, and Satan standing at his right hand to oppose him.

- a. The word Satan is the Hebrew word 7854 –(saw-tawn) – or Satan or opponent – or arch-enemy of good – or adversary – or accuser.
 - 1. Though out scripture he is called by everyone of these names plus several More.

Job. 1 : 7 - 1Pet. 5 : 6 – 8 - Matt. 12 : 42 – 44 - Ps. 109 : 1- 6

- b. Several things we can glean from Job 1 : 6 – 7.

- 1. Satan has access to the throne room of God
 - a. This could raise more questions than it answers.
 - 1. One would be.
 - a. If God cannot look upon sin, then how does sin enter the throne room, because Satan is sin.
 - b. He goes to and fro, as he pleases, doing his work.
 - 1. His work here seems to be gathering information to accuse the breathes.

Revelation 12:10 (NKJV)

¹⁰ Then I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, "Now salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of His Christ have come, for the accuser of our brethren, who accused them before our God day and night, has been cast down.

- c. He is never alone with God.
- d. There seems to be an appointed time for these sons of God, to make their appearance.
 - 1. Although John says, Who accused them day and night. But maybe Satan only appearance with them on accusations. Which would explain Job statement.
- e. God is open to his remarks or opinions.
- f. The sons of God must be the fallen angels of God.
 - 1. Coming also to accuse the brethren.
 - 2. We must remember that Satan is not omnipresence. In other words, he cannot be everywhere at the same time as God can be.
 - 3. Nor can the fallen angels, which would strengthen the point that these are fallen angels, doing the same thing that Satan is doing, accusing the brethren.

6. I do not believe that Satan has access to heaven itself. only to the throne room of God.

Job 1:6-7 (NKJV)

⁶ Now there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan also came among them.

⁷ And the LORD said to Satan, "From where do you come?" So Satan answered the LORD and said, "From going to and fro on the earth, and from walking back and forth on it."

a. Why?

1. Because he is a master deceiver.

2. He deceived once, he would try it again

3. There is only one war mentioned in scripture and Satan and his followers were cast out of heaven for good.

4. Now they only have access to the throne of God.

Isiah 14 : 1 2- 14 - Rev. 12 : 6 – 10

b. Scripture teaches that at the end of times at the great white throne judgment all sinners will have access to the throne room of God called the great white throne judgment to be judged, but still not have access to heaven itself.

Revelation 20:1-5 (NKJV)

¹ Then I saw an angel coming down from heaven, having the key to the bottomless pit and a great chain in his hand. ² He laid hold of the dragon, that serpent of old, who is *the* Devil and Satan, and bound him for a thousand years; ³ and he cast him into the bottomless pit, and shut him up, and set a seal on him, so that he should deceive the nations no more till the thousand years were finished. But after these things he must be released for a little while. ⁴ And I saw thrones, and they sat on them, and judgment was committed to them. Then *I saw* the souls of those who had been beheaded for their witness to Jesus and for the word of God, who had not worshiped the beast or his image, and had not received *his* mark on their foreheads or on their hands. And they lived and reigned with Christ for a thousand years. ⁵ But the rest of the dead did not live again until the thousand years were finished. This *is* the first resurrection.

7. In scripture you will find the term sons of God mentioned eleven times.
 Gen. 6 : 2 - Gen. 6 : 4 - Job. 1 : 6 - Job. 2 : 1 - Job. 38 : 7
 John 1 : 12 - Rom. 8 : 14 – Rom. 8 : 19 - Phil. 2 ; 15 - 1 John 3 ; 1 - 2
- a. In Genesis they are the offspring of Cain.
1. Meaning this that the sons of evil-(Cain)- started having relationships with the daughters of Abel –(Good).
 - a. We must remember that angels cannot reproduce.
 1. Demons can possess a persons body and can oppress a persons Mind and spirit – We call that depression.
 Mark 5:15 (NKJV)
- ¹⁵ Then they came to Jesus, and saw the one *who had been* demon-possessed and had the legion, sitting and clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid.
2. But demons cannot have sexual intercourse with human beings without the aid of another human body.
 3. But a demon possessed person can have a sexual relationship with other human beings which was happening in the book of genesis.
 4. Paul warned us about being unequally yoked together for a reason.
 11 Cor. 6 : 14 – 15 - 1 Cor. 5 – 11 – 13
 5. But that still does not mean that a child born from such a relationship will be demon possessed.
 6. These is what was happening in the boof Of Genesis evil marked people were having sexual relationships with the good people.
- b. In Old Testament times the normal men could be referred to as Sons of God are even giants.
- c. Because before the flood men grew much larger than they do today.
- b. Many say even Noah was approx. fifteen feet tall.
- b. In Job these are fallen angles.
 Job. 1 : 6 – 7 -- Job. 2 : 1 - Job. 38 : 7
- c. In John they are referred to as those who have placed their faith in Christ.
 John 1 : 12
- d. In Romans they are referred to as those who are led by the spirit of God.
 Rom. 8 : 14 – Rom. 8 : 19
- e. In Philippines they are referred to as the blames one of God.
 Phil. 2 : 15
- f. In 1 John they are referred to as to beloved of God.
 I John 3 : 1 - 2

8. In chapter twelve, we must remember that this is a ongoing statement John is making about the vision he is seeing.
- a. First – He see the women fleeing into the wilderness.
 - b. Secondly – He saw God provisions for her and child.
 - c. Third – He saw the number of days she will be provided for.
 - d. Fourth – He saw the arch angle Micheal and his angles wage war against Satan and his deceived followers.
 - e. Fifth – He saw the casting out of Satan and his fallen angles.
 - f. Sixth – He see the place where they were cast to.
 - g. All are a ongoing vision or series of events.

9. Then John stops seeing and starts hearing or listening.

Revelation 12:10 (NKJV)

¹⁰ Then I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, "Now salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of His Christ have come, for the accuser of our brethren, who accused them before our God day and night, has been cast down.

- a. What he heard was the proclamation of the Gospel.

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- b. He said I heard.
 1. That salvation.
 2. That strength.
 3. That the kingdom of God.
 4. That the power of God have come. (pass tense).
 - a. Have come is a pass tense statement - meaning that Christ has come.
 - b. Just as the war in heaven was a pass tense war.
 - c. So is the meaning His Christ have come, is a pass tense meaning.
 1. A battel was fought in heaven
 2. The war was won at Calvary.
- c. Who was this voice spoken to?
 1. The brethren.
- d. What did the voice say?
 1. Victory has been won.
 - a. Redemption has been won.
 - b. Forgiveness has been won.
 - c. Death and the grave has been conquered.
 - e. Sin has been defeated.

1 Cor. 15 : 50 - 58

10. The voice declared that the great strength of God has been demonstrated at Calvary.

a. By the resurrection of His Son.

John 11:25-26 (NKJV)

²⁵ Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. ²⁶ And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

b. That salvation by faith comes through that same Son.

Romans 5:8 (NKJV)

⁸ But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

2 Corinthians 5:21 (NKJV)

²¹ For He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

1. They are not angels.

Matthew 22:29-32 (NKJV)

²⁹ Jesus answered and said to them, "You are mistaken, not knowing the Scriptures nor the power of God.³⁰ For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels of God in heaven.³¹ But concerning the resurrection of the dead, have you not read what was spoken to you by God, saying,³² *'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'?* God is not the God of the dead, but of the living."

5. Some say there are two possibilities for the sons of God
 - a. Some say they were the descendants of Cain.
 - b. some say they are the descendants of Abel.

6. If we look at verse five we might lean toward Cain.

Genesis 6:5 (NKJV)

⁵ Then the LORD saw that the wickedness of man *was* great in the earth, and *that* every intent of the thoughts of his heart *was* only evil continually.

7. We also must remember that the Book of Job is the oldest book in the bible.
 - a. Meaning this that the term used there could have a totally different meaning.
 - b. He lived before the time of Moses who wrote Genesis.
 - c. Job fits somewhere between Gen. 11 and chapter 14
 - d. He lived between 1485 to 1445 B.C.
 - e. Genesis was written somewhere around 1400 B.C.
8. Archaeology confirms daily that most who lived before the flood lived longer
So were much taller than we are today even up to fifteen feet tall or more.
