 - a. First to steal, kill, destroy and hope of those who are lost.
 - b. Secondly to stop any and all from
 - 1. Receiving Christ.
 - 2. The witness for Christ.
 - 3. The testimony of Christ.
 - 4. Those who are killed by any means during the tribulation will never have the opportunity to be saved.

- c. Third To stop or foul any and all prophecy.
 - 1. Why?
 - a. Because if he can prevent any thing that God has said in His word from coming true are from coming to pass.
 - b. Then he can prove God is not the real and true God.

 - b. It is used of Christ Rev. 8 3 5
 - c. It is used of the angel of the Lord or the angel of God meaning the presence of deity of God in angel form.

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- d. It is used of prophets Haggi 1:13
- e. It is used of spiritual beings who serve God.

 - a. That seven years to troubles.
- 13. Seven facts about angels that we need to know.
 - a. Angel are created beings that appear to men. Ps. 104:4 Heb. 1:14 Col 1:16
 - b. Angels are numerous Ps. 68: 17 Matt. 26: 53 Heb. 12: 22
 - c. Angels are extremely superior to men in Intelligence and knowledge.

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- d. Angels posses great power. -11 King 19:35- Matt. 28:3-11 Pet 2:11 Rev. 12:1-9- Rev. 20:1-2
- e. Angles observe men (for God) Eccles. 5:6 I Cor. 4:9 Ephes. 3:10
- f. Angles have fallen from the grace and favor of God. Jude 6-11 Pet. 2-4 Rev. $20:10-Job.\ 1:6$
- g. Satan is the greatest deceiver among all the angles.
 - 1. In the tribulation he will deceive the entire world.

 - c. Who was this voice spoken to?
 - 1. The brethren.
 - d. What did the voice say?
 - 1. Victory has been won.
 - a. Redemption has been won.
 - b. Forgiveness has been won.
 - c. Death and the grave has been conquered.
 - e. Sin has been defeated.
