John 5:21-23 (NKJV)

²¹ For as the Father raises the dead and gives life to *them*, even so the Son gives life to whom He will. ²² For the Father judges no one, but has committed all judgment to the Son, ²³ that all should honor the Son just as they honor the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent Him.

 - 1. The Time Has come – (or time has ran out).
 - 2. The harvest is ripe – (or souls are ready).
 - 3. Thrust in thy sickle – (or began the judgments)
 - (or let the judgment begin).
 - 4. Harvest is always seen as a form of judgement in scripture.

1 Thessalonians 4:16-18 (NKJV)

¹⁶ For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first.

¹⁷ Then we who are alive *and* remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord.

¹⁸ Therefore comfort one another with these words.

12. Verse sixteen says and he thrust in His sickle, and the earth was reaped (or the harvest was completed).

- a. Except the nocks and corners that have to be gleamed.

Ruth 2:2 (NKJV)

² So Ruth the Moabitess said to Naomi, "Please let me go to the field, and glean heads of grain after *him* in whose sight I may find favor." And she said to her, "Go, my daughter."

- b. It's a Mosaic law that the nocks and corners of a field or vineyard had to be left for the poor to glean for food.
- c. Its God way of taking care of the poor.
(they were not given but had to work for their food)
(The nocks and Connors was where they could get food by working)

Leviticus 19:9-10 (NKJV)

⁹ 'When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not wholly reap the corners of your field, nor shall you gather the gleanings of your harvest.

¹⁰ And you shall not glean your vineyard, nor shall you gather *every* grape of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the stranger: I *am* the LORD your God.

13. The great harvest (or thrust in His sickle) is the rapture of the church.
- a. What is left will be gleaned from all four corners of the earth.
(fulfilling Mosaic law).
 - b. Which is the great multitude we read about in chapter seven of revelation.

Revelation 7:13-17 (NKJV)

¹³ Then one of the elders answered, saying to me, "Who are these arrayed in white robes, and where did they come from?" ¹⁴ And I said to him, "Sir, you know." So he said to me, "These are the ones who come out of the great tribulation, and washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. ¹⁵ Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve Him day and night in His temple. And He who sits on the throne will dwell among them. ¹⁶ They shall neither hunger anymore nor thirst anymore; the sun shall not strike them, nor any heat; ¹⁷ for the Lamb who is in the midst of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to living fountains of waters. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."
