6. John is shown seven more angels departing from the throne room of God.

Revelation 15:6 (NKJV)

- ⁶ And out of the temple came the seven angels having the seven plagues, clothed in pure bright linen, and having their chests girded with golden bands.
 - a. They depart from the Holy of Holies
 - 1. From the throne of God
 - 2. From the presence of God
 - a. There is no longer a outer court
 - 1. Because there is no longer a vail of separation.

- 2. There is no longer a outer court or the holy place.
 - a. Jesus became our.
 - 1. Holy place
 - a. The light of the world $\,$ John 9:5- John 8:12
 - b. The bread of life John 6:12 John 6:35
 - c. The alter of incense Heb. 7:25
 - b. Jesus became the opened the door. John 14:6
- 7. Each angel was entrusted with one single Bowl –(or judgment or Plague).
 - a. All bowls have their pacific target or purpose.
 - 1.The word plague means strip or strips are wound or blow.

b. Rev. 15 verse one tells us that these are the final or last blows of judgements.

Revelation 15:1 (NKJV)

- ¹ Then I saw another sign in heaven, great and marvelous: seven angels having the seven last plagues, for in them the wrath of God is complete.
- 8. These last and final Bowls judgments are the full weight of the wrath of God upon a evil and corrupt world.
 - a. Its God final punishment.
- 9. They know the heart of God.
 - a. David told Salmon to have the heart of God.

1 Chronicles 28:9 (NKJV)

⁹ "As for you, my son Solomon, know the God of your father, and serve Him with a loyal heart and with a willing mind; for the LORD searches all hearts and understands all the intent of the thoughts. If you seek Him, He will be found by you; but if you forsake Him, He will cast you off forever.

10. We also should know the heart of God.

Romans 8:26-27 (NKJV)

- Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. ²⁷ Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit *is*, because He makes intercession for the saints according to *the will of* God.

Hebrews 7:25 (NKJV)

- ²⁵ Therefore He is also able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them.
 - b. This is what Jesus meant when he said until now you have asked nothing in my name.
