

The Christmas Oracles Text

JESUS OUR LIGHT | Isaiah 7–9

Isaiah's prophecy to King Ahaz about the coming exile for idolatrous Israel, but also God's promises of a Savior King who will deliver.

IESUS OUR REST | Isaiah 11:1-10

Isaiah's prophecy of Jesus bringing ultimate righteousness and rest.

JESUS OUR MERCY | *Isaiah 16:5, Isaiah 55*

Ísaiah's description of Jesus' compassion and grace, and the new covenant that Jesus' birth will provide.

JESUS OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS | Jer. 23:1–8, 33:14–22; Zec. 9:9–10:12, 12:8–10, 13:1, 14:8–9 Select prophecies describing Jesus as our source of righteousness. Jeremiah prophesied to Judah (the southern part of Israel) before the 70 years of Babylonian captivity and exile. Zechariah prophesied to the same region after the captive Jews returned from Babylon 70 years later.

IESUS OUR PEACE | Ezekiel 34:22–26

Ezekiel's prophecy was in Babylon during the exile to give the exiled Jews hope that God was sovereign in their hardship.

JESUS OUR GOD AND KING | Isaiah 7:14; Ezekiel 37:21–28

See above regarding Ezekiel.

A SELECTION OF PROPHECIES ON JESUS AND SALVATION IN THE OLD TESTAMENT: Genesis 3:15, 9:27, 12:3, 22:18, 49:8–10; Numbers 24:17–19; 2 Samuel 7:12–29; Psalm 2, 89,

132; Amos 9:11–15; Micah 5:2 (Among many others)

The Christmas Story in the New Testament

Matthew 1-2

Begins with Jesus' lineage, tells the story of Joseph, and recounts the visit of the Magi.

Mark

Does not include a Christmas narrative, but begins with the ministries of Jesus and John the Baptist.

Luke 1-2

The story of Mary, Elizabeth, Zacharias, Bethlehem, shepherds, angels, and Jesus as a baby at the temple.

John 1:1-14

The Cosmos View of Christmas and God becoming man.

Hebrews 1

The description of Jesus being God in the flesh and God's way of speaking to man after the Old Testament.

The Christmas Oracles Series How to Get the Most Out of This Journey

These are the Christmas Oracles that we will be examining during December. I want to encourage you to dive into these passages in your personal study, which will prepare you for the series and bless your personal growth.

As you read, I encourage you to do the following:

- 1. Read the given passage, but also read the section preceding and following each passage for context.
- 2. Read the passage in several English versions. Old Testament prophets can be difficult to follow. While I personally rely on the KIV as authoritative, I find it helps my understanding to read in the ESV, NLT, and perhaps others to ensure that I'm grasping the vernacular, syntax, and grammatical flow of a passage.
- 3. Read the study notes on these passages from a good study Bible. I recommend The Life Application Study Bible if you can invest into a good resource. There are also several free options online and through apps such as The Faith Life Study Bible, the ESV Study Bible, StudyBible.org and others.
- Seek to understand what the author and earliest receivers would have understood, and ask these basic questions:
 - · Who is writing?
 - · To whom is this being written?
 - What is the historical context?
 - What is the essence of this message from God to these original recipients?
- 5. Then ask: How does this message apply to my life today? Understand the context before you seek to apply to modern life.
