EXPOSITION:

We celebrate Christmas by giving gifts, but did you know it's a trend started by God?

In the first pages of the Bible we read that God created the whole world and everything in it. The Bible says that everything He made was good, perfect, and wonderful, and He gave it to us to develop and explore.

But, not long after they had received the gift, Adam and Eve broke the only rule God had given them – they ate from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. They sinned by rebelling against God – by doing what they wanted to do instead of what He said. And in the process, they suddenly ruined the perfect gift they had just been given. It was like dropping a beautiful piece of custom-made pottery on a concrete floor - there was no taking it back, no getting another, no fixing it with a little bit of glue. They had just broken their relationship with God and with each other.

Fortunately, God came looking for them; He talked with them about what they had done. He told them there would be consequences for this rebellion – that justice would be served, but He also promised mercy would be shown. One day, He would pay for what we had broken and provide us a way back into relationship with Him.

He promised a Savior would come, as the Christmas Carol says, to 'save us all from Satan's power, when we were gone astray.' A Messiah would come to bring us God's 'rest' and deliver us from 'dismay.'

15 Then the angel of the LORD called to Abraham a second time from heaven 16 and said, "By myself I have sworn," this is the LORD's declaration: "Because you have done this thing and have not withheld your only son, 17 I will indeed bless you and make your offspring as numerous as the stars of the sky and the sand on the seashore. Your offspring will possess the city gates of their enemies. 18 And all the nations of the earth will be blessed by your offspring because you have obeyed my command."

We read in the book of Isaiah

From Chapter 7

14 Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel.

And From Chapter 9

9:2 The people who walked in darkness Have seen a great light; Those who dwelt in the land of the shadow of death, Upon them a light has shined.

9:6 For unto us a Child is born,
Unto us a Son is given;
And the government will be upon His shoulder.
And His name will be called
Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
7 Of the increase of *His* government and peace *There will be* no end,
Upon the throne of David and over His kingdom,
To order it and establish it with judgment and justice
From that time forward, even forever.
The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this.

That name, Immanuel, means God with us, and it stirred up a hope among the people, that some day God would once again walk among us like He had with Adam and Eve.

We learn more from the prophet Micah in the book of Micah, Chapter Five

2 "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."

3 Therefore Israel will be abandoned until the time when she who is in labor bears a son, and the rest of his brothers return to join the Israelites.

4 He will stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God. And they will live securely, for then his greatness will reach to the ends of the earth.

Christmas is a season of expectation – especially for little kids – they look forward to what is coming and all the good stuff they'll get. But the first Christmas kind of took everyone by surprise. No one knew it was coming. It wasn't on the calendar.

God suddenly interrupted the life of a young girl, a virgin, named Mary. He sent an angel that told her she would conceive the Messiah Isaiah had promised. She had some questions, but ultimately surrendered to what God wanted to do and rejoiced in the coming of her Lord.

We learn the story from the Book of Luke's Gospel, Chapter One:

Luke 1:26 Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, 27 to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. 28 And having come in, the angel said to her, "Rejoice, highly favored *one*, the Lord *is* with you; blessed *are* you among women!"

29 But when she saw *him,* she was troubled at his saying, and considered what manner of greeting this was. 30 Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. 31 And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name JESUS. 32 He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. 33 And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end."

34 Then Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I do not know a man?" 35 And the angel answered and said to her, "*The* Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God. 36 Now indeed, Elizabeth your relative has also conceived a son in her old age; and this is now the sixth month for her who was called barren. 37 For with God nothing will be impossible."

38 Then Mary said, "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

The book of Matthew's Gospel tells us more. We read in Chapter One:

18 This is how Jesus the Messiah was born. His mother, Mary, was engaged to be married to Joseph. But before the marriage took place, while she was still a virgin, she became pregnant through the power of the Holy Spirit. 19 Joseph, her fiancé, was a good man and did not want to disgrace her publicly, so he decided to break the engagement quietly.

20 As he considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream. "Joseph, son of David," the angel said, "do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. For the child within her was conceived by the Holy Spirit. 21 And she will have a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

22 All of this occurred to fulfill the Lord's message through his prophet Isaiah:

23 "Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel, which means 'God is with us.'"

The Bible says that all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. None of us is truly good. We're all guilty of doing things we shouldn't have done or not doing things we should have done. And that's why the good news of our salvation is offered to everyone.

When Jesus came, they didn't just brief the President, it wasn't classified, it wasn't a secret someone had to let you in on. No, God sent word to lowly shepherds. Normal people. People without a rank or a title in fact, He let them in on what was happening first.

We read about it in the book of Luke's Gospel Chapter Two:

Luke 2:8 Now there were in the same country shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid. 10 Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. 11 For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. 12 And this *will be* the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger."

13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying:

14 "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!"

15 So it was, when the angels had gone away from them into heaven, that the shepherds said to one another, "Let us now go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us." 16 And they came with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the Babe lying in a manger.

The child we celebrate on Christmas is also a king. No matter what our job or position, our experience or our title, we must all bow our knee before the boy in the manger like the wise men did so long ago.

A reading from the book of Matthew's Gospel, Chapter Two: SEP

Matthew 2:1 Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, 2 saying, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him."

3 When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.

4 And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born.

5 So they said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it is written by the prophet:

6 'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, Are not the least among the rulers of Judah; For out of you shall come a Ruler Who will shepherd My people Israel.'"

7 Then Herod, when he had secretly called the wise men, determined from them what time the star appeared. 8 And he sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the young Child, and when you have found *Him,* bring back word to me, that I may come and worship Him also."

9 When they heard the king, they departed; and behold, the star which they had seen in the East went before them, till it came and stood over where the young Child was. 10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceedingly great joy. 11 And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and worshiped Him. And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Matthew says wise men followed the light of the star to find Him in the manger, but the Apostle John tells us Jesus was actually the light of men – the light that casts the darkness out of our souls and then shines through us to the rest of the world.

We read in the book of John's Gospel, Chapter One:

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. 4 In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. 5 And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

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10 He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him. 11 He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him. 12 But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: 13 who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.
