

Big Idea: Jesus judges with grace and mercy; so, we amplify grace and mercy when we must judge others.

"Judge not, that you be not judged. ² For with the judgment you pronounce you will be judged, and with the measure you use it will be measured to you. ³ Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? ⁴ Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when there is the log in your own eye? ⁵ You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye. ⁶ 'Do not give dogs what is holy, and do not throw your pearls before pigs, lest they trample them underfoot and turn to attack you.'" (Mat 7:1-6 ESV)

Big Idea: Jesus judges with grace and mercy; so, we amplify grace and mercy when we must judge others.

Judge like Jesus!

Context matters (Mt 6:1).

- 1. You set the standard (7:1-2).
- 2. Take the plank out of your eye (7:3-5).
- 3. Practice discernment (7:6).

Context Matters.

"Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them" (Mt 6:1)

Be careful how you:

- i. Give (6:2-4).
- ii. Pray (6:5-14).
- iii. Fast (6:16-18).
- iv. Worry (6:19-34).
- v. <u>Judge (7:1-4).</u>

It's okay to judge ...

- i. We must judge between good and evil.
- ii. In context, Jesus judges.
- iii. The issue here revolves around unfair judgement.

1. You set the standard for you (vv. 1-2)

"Judge not, that you be not judged. ² For with the judgment you pronounce <u>you will be judged</u>, and with the measure you use <u>it will be measured to you</u>."

Understand the seriousness of judging.

"²⁰ And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him ... evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, ²² coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. ²³ All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person." (Mark 7:20-23).

Judge others the way you want to be judged.

- i. Stay away from gossip/slander.
- ii. Empathize with the other person.
- iii. Judge by principle, not prejudice.

2. Take the plank out of your eye (vv. 3-5)!

³ Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? ⁴ Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when there is the log in your own eye? ⁵ You hypocrite, <u>first</u> take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye.

Hypocritical judgement happens when:

- i. We are incapable of judging righteously.
- ii. We are unqualified to judge someone else's life.
- iii. Incapable + Unqualified = Hypocrite!

Judge yourself first.

- i. Make a sin-ventory (Ps 139:23).
- ii. Seek God's forgiveness (1Jn 1:9).
- iii. Seek the forgiveness of others.

Help your brother take the spec out of his eye.

- i. Take time to learn about that guy.
- ii. Come beside them with an attitude of helpfulness.
- iii. Seek to gain a brother.

4. Beware of hypocritical judgment (v. 6).

⁶ "Do not give dogs what is holy, and do not throw your pearls before pigs, lest they trample them underfoot and turn to attack you."

Two interpretations

- i. Don't share the good news with hardhearted people.
- ii. If you practice unfair judgement, it's dangerous.

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People love to judge; Jesus loves to forgive. Be like Jesus.
