

Big Idea: False teachers seek to destroy us; so, study the Bible and stay safe.

¹⁵ Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. ¹⁶ You will recognize them by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? ¹⁷ So, every healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. ¹⁸ A healthy tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a diseased tree bear good fruit. ¹⁹ Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. ²⁰ Thus you will recognize them by their fruits. (Mat 7:15-20)

Big Idea: False teachers seek to destroy us; so, study the Bible and stay safe.

Warning: False Teachers are on the Path!

- 1. Judge Not!
- 2. Look out for false teachers (v. 15).
- 3. Recognize the fruit (vv. 16-18).
- 4. Heed the warning (vv. 19-20).

1. Judge Not!

"Judge not, that you be not judged" (Matt 7:1).

The Duck Principle

- i. If it looks, walks, and talks like a duck ... it's a duck.
- ii. Not judgmental, but wise.
- iii. Necessary to protect the saints (1Co 5:13; 2Ti 4:1-5).

- 2. Look out for false teachers (v. 15).
- ¹⁵ <u>Beware</u> of false prophets, who come to you in <u>sheep's</u> <u>clothing</u> but inwardly are <u>ravenous wolves</u>.

Watch out!

- i. Sheep's clothing they look like us!
- ii. Ravenous wolves they seek to destroy!

Make a point to pay attention to the people preaching (Acts 17:11).

3. Recognize the fruit (vv. 16-18).

¹⁶ You will recognize them by their fruits. Recognize the fruit (vv. 16-18).

- i. Diseased trees look like healthy ones.
- ii. Bad fruit == poisonous fruit.
- iii. The fruit reveals the tree.

Watchout for 4 Common False-teacher Fruits.

- i. Subtle change of Jesus, God, or the Spirit.
- ii. Easy salvation and/or life.
- iii. Minimize Christ and Emphasize Money.
- iv. Corrupt Character (pride, porn, lies, etc).

Good-teacher Fruit

- i. Good character (1 Tim 3:1-13).
- ii. Preach the Word (2 Tim 4:2-3).

To avoid falling prey to false prophets, study the Bible.

4. Heed the warning (vv. 19-20).

¹⁹ Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. ²⁰ Thus you will recognize them by their fruits.

Teachings from corrupt teachers are worthless. Don't try to learn from them.

We all deserve fire, but Jesus died on a cross so we would never see the fire.
