Be the Reason Someone Rejoices (Phil 1:18-26)

Big Idea: Supporting one another produces joy; so, we strive to give others reason to rejoice.

Yes, and I will rejoice, ¹⁹ for I know that through <u>your</u> <u>prayers</u> and the <u>help of the Spirit</u> of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, ²⁰ as it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that <u>with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body</u>, whether by life or by death.

²¹ For to me <u>to live is Christ, and to die is gain</u>. ²² If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. ²³ I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. ²⁴ But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account.

²⁵ Convinced of this, <u>I know that I will remain and</u> <u>continue with you all</u>, for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶ so that in me you may have ample <u>cause to glory in Christ Jesus</u>, because of my coming to you again.

Big Idea: Supporting one another produces joy; so, we strive to give others reason to rejoice.

Be the Reason Someone Rejoices

- 1. Live courageously (vv. 18-20).
- 2. Live/Die for Christ (vv. 21-24).
- 3. Live to impact someone's life (vv. 25-26).

1. Live courageously (vv. 18-20).

"Yes, and I will rejoice, ¹⁹ for I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, ²⁰ as it is my eager expectation and hope that <u>I will not be at all ashamed</u>, but that **with full courage** now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death."

Be Courageous because:

- i. Prayer works (v. 19a).
- ii. The Spirit helps (v. 19b).
- iii. Salvation comes (deliverance, v. 19b).
- iv. Gospel will succeed (v. 20a).
- v. Christ will be honored (v. 20b).
- vi. God knows best (v. 20c).

Joy arises from:

- i. Praying for one another.
- ii. Relying on the Spirit.
- iii. Hoping in the Lord.
- iv. Honoring Christ.

- 2. Live/Die for Christ (vv. 21-24).
- ²¹ For to me <u>to live is Christ</u>, and to die is gain. ²² If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall <u>choose</u> I cannot tell. ²³ <u>I am hard pressed between the two</u>. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far <u>better</u> [in this context]. ²⁴ But to remain in the flesh is more <u>necessary</u> on your account.

Live=Christ

- i. Everything we do is for Christ (Col 3:23).
- ii. Seek first the kingdom of God (Mt 6:33).
- iii. Love the Lord with all your heart (Mt 22:37).
- iv. Present your bodies as a living sacrifice (Rom 12:1-2).

Die=Gain

- i. God has prepared a glorious place for us (1 Cor 2:9).
- ii. An eternal weight of glory awaits us (2 Cor 4:17-18).
- iii. Our inheritance is secure (Eph 1:4-14).

- 3. Live to impact someone's life (vv. 25-26).
- ²⁵ Convinced of this, I know that <u>I will remain</u> and continue with you all, <u>for your progress and joy</u> in the faith, ²⁶ <u>so that in me you may have</u> ample cause to glory in Christ Jesus, because of my coming to you again.

Give others cause to glory in Christ.

- i. Choose to be used by God (22-23a, 25).
- ii. The *right* thing may not be our preference (23b).
- iii. We control our response to difficulty (23-24).
- iv. Our actions impact other's lives (24-26).

Find joy as you give other reason to glory in Christ Jesus.
