Bible Text: John 3:1-21

Open Up

When and how were you *born again*? Who had an influence in your salvation?

Who is someone you have helped find salvation? How so?

Dig In

Read John 3:1-8

Why do you think Nicodemus came to Jesus at night? Why was it risky for Nicodemus to turn to Jesus for spiritual answers?

Why do you think Jesus used the metaphor “born again” to describe salvation? Why was this concept so hard for Nicodemus to grasp?

What do you think Jesus means by being “born of water and the Spirit”? Is Jesus saying you need water baptism to be saved? Why or why not?

What do we learn about the Holy Spirit from Jesus comparing the Spirit to wind?

Read John 3:9-15

Jesus refers to Moses lifting up the serpent in the wilderness (Numbers 21:4–9). Why does Jesus connect this story to Himself? What does this comparison teach us about faith and salvation?

Why is it sometimes hard for religious people to understand the gospel?

Read John 3:16-21

Based on vs. 16-17, how would you describe how God views people in this world? How do these verses communicate the heart of the gospel?

Sometimes people will ask, “Why does a loving God send people to hell?” How could vs. 18-21 be used when addressing this question?

What is the evidence for and against someone truly being “born again”?

Close Out

Read Luke 15:1-7

Do you find joy in seeing others come to know Jesus? How so?

Can you say that it’s a priority, like the shepherd in this parable, to help the lost be found? How does your life reflect that?

Who is the “one” in your life that needs to be found?
