Bible Text: John 14

Open Up

If someone asked you what the gospel is, how would you answer them?

Dig In

The gospel ends with us going home. Read John 14:1-3

How should the promise of heaven shape the way Christians live today?

What is the difference between living as though earth is your permanent home versus living with heaven as your true home?

The gospel is both inclusive and exclusive. Read John 14:4-6

Jesus says He is "the way, the truth, and the life." What does each of those descriptions teach us about Him? *The Way *The Truth *The Life

How is the gospel both inclusive and exclusive? Why do you think people struggle with Jesus' claim that no one comes to the Father except through Him?

The gospel requires belief that Jesus is God. Read John 14:7-11

What evidence does Jesus give that He is one with the Father? Why is believing that Jesus is fully God essential to the gospel?

How would Christianity change if Jesus were only a great teacher instead of God in the flesh?

The gospel gives power to our prayers. Read John 14:12-14

What do you think Jesus means when He says believers will do "greater works"? What does it mean to pray "in Jesus' name"?

How is biblical prayer different from simply asking God to give us everything we want?

The gospel empowers us to love and obey God through the Holy Spirit.

Read John 14:15-31

According to Jesus, what is the relationship between loving Him and obeying Him? Who is the Holy Spirit, and what ministries does Jesus say He performs in the life of a believer?

Jesus repeatedly talks about peace in this chapter. How is His peace different from the peace the world offers? How has the Holy Spirit helped bring peace into your life?

Which of the five truths from this chapter impacted you the most, and why?

What is one area of your life where you've been living more for this world than for eternity? Is there one specific command of Jesus you know you need to obey this week?
