Dear fellow members of our church family,





Florida Teen and Youth Camps will be taking place this year from June 25 - July **1, 2023**. We are planning a great time of fun, fellowship and spirituality for your campers and we can't wait to see them!

Here's what you need to know:

Youth Camp is for incoming **4th - 6th grade** students. We will have limited spots available for 4th grade campers, so please register early!

Teen Camp is for incoming **7th - 12th grade** students.

The cost for Camp will be **\$550** per child.

Save your spot by completing your registration and making a **\$50** *nonrefundable* deposit. You can make payments online at any time. Your remaining balance will be due by **Sunday, June 25** when you arrive at camp.

Campers will receive two t-shirts as part of their registration. If you would like to purchase additional t-shirts, they are available as Add-ons. You may also pre-purchase concession cards in \$5 increments. The cost for these Add-ons must be paid when you register.

You must complete our Online Waivers for your child's registration to be **complete.** The waivers will be available to you at the end of your registration and also in your confirmation email.

Registration closes at midnight on June 4, 2023.

Anna Maria Jarvis (May 1, 1864 – November 24, 1948)

As Christians, we know that motherhood is a calling from God, and that a mother's love is a reflection of His love for us. That's why Mother's Day is such an important day for us, as it gives us a chance to honor and celebrate the mothers in our lives, and the many ways that they reflect God's love.

One woman who knew the power of a mother's love was Anna Jarvis. When Anna lost her mother, Ann, she was devastated by the loss, but inspired by her mother's love and compassion to honor all mothers. She campaigned tirelessly for years to establish Mother's Day as an official holiday in the United States, and her hard work paid off in 1914 when President Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation recognizing the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.

But Anna's story is about more than just the establishment of a holiday. It's about the power of a mother's love to inspire and motivate us, and the importance of honoring and cherishing our mothers, not just on Mother's Day, but every day of the year.

As Christians, we are called to love and honor our mothers, just as God loves and honors us. We can do this by showing them gratitude and respect, by spending time with them and listening to their wisdom, and by modeling their love and compassion in our own lives.

Jacklyn Harold "Jack" Lucas (February 14, 1928 – June 5, 2008)

In 1945, a young American soldier named Jack Lucas was fighting in Iwo Jima during World War II. During the battle, Jack's unit came under attack, and he jumped on two grenades to protect his fellow soldiers. Miraculously, Jack survived the blast, but suffered extensive injuries that left him with lifelong physical and emotional scars.

Years later, on Memorial Day, Jack reflected on the sacrifice of his fellow soldiers who gave their lives for their country. He realized that his own survival was a testament to their bravery and sacrifice, and he dedicated the rest of his life to honoring and remembering them.

Jack became a speaker and advocate for veteran's causes, and he was awarded the Medal of Honor for his own heroic actions on the battlefield. He spent the rest of his life working to ensure that the sacrifices of his fellow soldiers were never forgotten.
