Intro Question - *What kind of things should a church do when they gather together?* **Main Point -** The church exists to worship God, build up believers, and evangelize the world.

Will's teaching part 1

Question 1 - Why do you think Buck Run usually preaches through books of the Bible on Sunday morning?

We are committed to Expository Preaching, which aims at communicating the meaning of the text we are preaching. Passages in the Bible are best understood in their context. Preaching through books in the Bible helps people understand the whole picture of what the authors of Scripture meant when they wrote it. Preaching through books of the Bible also pushes us to teach difficult parts of Scripture and to have a well-rounded theology formed through our teaching.

Question 2 - What are some things you might be tempted to let get in the way of regularly gathering with the church? How can you resist those temptations?

The world is full of distractions and other ways we might use our Sunday mornings or other church times. Sleep, sports, hobbies, work, and overall busyness can get in the way of our gatherings. But it is important for us to commit ourselves before the temptation comes to always prioritize the gathering of the church.
