Haggai

- 1. Those in Jerusalem were more concerned with rebuilding their own houses than the temple. How do we sin in similar ways?
- 2. Why is God's promised presence among the people the greatest possible blessing? How does Jesus fulfill this and other similar promises of divine presence in the Old Testament?
- 3. Why do you think God promised to bless the people as he did in Haggai 2:19?

## Zechariah

- 1. The people in Judah looked at their situation and wondered if God keeps his promises and if it was worth worshipping him. Have you ever felt that way? What's Zechariah's response?
- 2. Zechariah consistently calls the people to repentance. What is repentance? How does Zechariah describe it?
- 3. Zechariah has a lot to say about the coming Messiah. Look at Zechariah 6:9-15, 9:9-10, and/or 13:7-9. How has Jesus fulfilled these passages?

## Malachi

- 1. Those in Judah question God's love for them in Malachi 1:2. Have you ever done the same? How does the gospel help us answer that question biblically?
- 2. God tells the priests that their irreverent sacrifices are meaningless. What does that teach us about worship?
- 3. Malachi 3:6 teaches us a key aspect about God's nature he does not change! (look at the verse in context) Why is that good news for God's people?
