Wisdom is fearing the LORD, being teachable, and having skill in godly living. The source, the means, and the goal of wisdom is the LORD.



- Most are general principles and observations. Example:
 Proverbs 26:27
- Some do contain eternal truths that always strictly apply.
 Example: Proverbs 16:33



- They are general principles- not guarantees
- Often horizontal in nature-
- Often utilize parallelism-
 - "The wise of heart will receive commandments, but a babbling fool will come to ruin" – Proverbs 10:8



- Often utilize Figures of Speech
- Seek to summarize
- Always apply (slow down, think, meditate)
