Regarding the **wicked**:

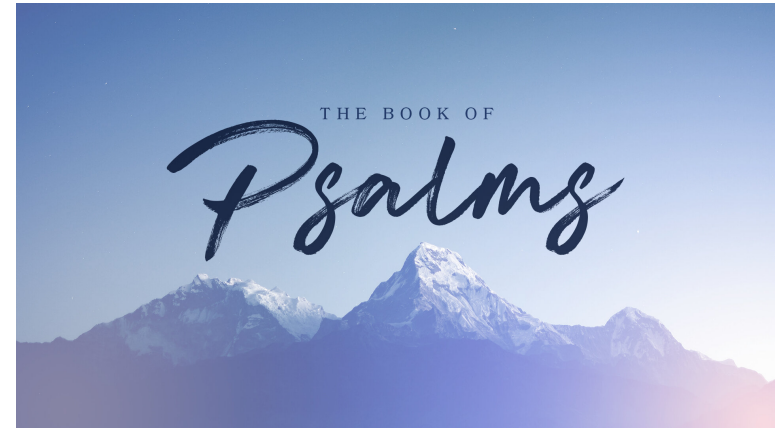
- *sinner* will not stand in the assembly of the righteous (v.5).
