Title of Study: "The Revelation of Jesus Christ"

<u>Theme of Revelation:</u> The majesty and glory of the warrior lamb, King Jesus, who is coming again to rule and reign forever.

<u>Purpose:</u> To encourage and give hope to the persecuted church and call the church to faithful obedience.

Title: "Book of Deeds or Book of Life: Part 2"

Main idea: God will judge all unbelievers!

3 Facts

- 1. There will be nowhere to hide! (see notes from part 1).
- 2. All unbelievers will be judged according to their own righteousness!
 - vs (12) "the dead"
 - o Mentioned 4 times in vs. 12-13.
 - o First, we know this is only the unbelieving dead.
 - o vs (14) All of them cast into the eternal lake of fire.
 - o Believers will not be judged at this judgment.
 - o John 3:18
 - o John 5:24
 - o Romans 8:1
 - Believers will be judged for reward at the Judgment Seat of Christ for rewards.
 - o "The dead" are those that are not part of the First Resurrection.
 - o Revelation 20:6
 - o They are the "rest of the dead"
 - o Revelation 20:5
 - o "Small and great"
 - o From Hitler or Hussein to the unbeliever who lived in solitude.
 - O Social status, popularity, fame, fortune, citizenship, race none of these will have any bearing on the judgment.
 - vs (13) "Sea gave up the dead"
 - o I believe these are the bodies from the sea.
 - o Some say but there is no sea.
 - o Revelation 21:1
 - This could refer to evil as the sea is sometimes used in Scripture to describe evil.
 - However, if not, then I believe before there is no sea, it will give up the bodies that are in it.
 - This would include victims of the flood, shipwrecks, drownings, where bodies are not found, etc.
 - vs (13) "Death" delivered up the dead"
 - o This refers to the dead bodies everywhere else.

- vs (13) "Hades" "delivered up the dead"
 - o Similar to the Hebrew word 'Sheol"
 - o "Sheol" is used some 67 times in the Old Testament.
 - o It refers to realm of the dead in general or sometimes to the grave.
 - o "Hades" is used 10 times in the New Testament and is the place of punishment for the wicked dead spirits.
 - o It is not the final hell because it is about to be thrown into the Lake of Fire.
- So, the bodies of unbelievers will be resurrected from the ground and the sea. The souls of unbelievers will be raised from Hades.
 - This is the resurrection of the wicked!
 - o Daniel 12:2
 - o John 5:28-29
 - o Acts 24:15

*But how will they be judged?

- vs (12) "books were opened"
 - o What books?
 - o John 12:48
 - It is possible that one of the books used at the scene will be the Word of God, which is the standard for righteous living.
 - o vs (12) "another book "Book of Life"
 - Luke 10:20
 - Philippians 4:3
 - Revelation 13:8
 - Revelation 17:8
 - Revelation 21:27
 - This book contains the names of all believers.
 - Some believe everyone's name is written there to begin with and then unbelievers' names are "blotted out".
 - Exodus 32:32-33
 - This is the book of the living.
 - Psalm 69:28
 - "blotted out" of it simply meant to die physically and no longer be recorded among the living.
 - Revelation 3:5
 - The promise not to be blotted out does not necessarily mean that others will be blotted out.
 - Revelation 13:8 implies that unbelievers names were not recorded there from the foundation of the world.
- So, the Word of God is likely there and the Lamb's Book of Life is there, but what are the other books?
- vs (12) "judged according to their works"
 - o "the things written in the books" are their works.
 - o Luke 8:17
 - o 1Corinthians 4:5 (see also Romans 2:16; Luke 12:2-3; Matthew 12:36-37; Jeremiah 17:10).

- That problem is this: God is not going to look at His Word and look at their works and say "Oh well, you messed up but you did pretty good".
- o The standard is perfection!
- o Galatians 3:10
- o James 2:10
- All mankind falls short!
- o Romans 3:10-20
- o Romans 3:23
- o Romans 5:12
- o Romans 5:18
- o Adam's sin condemned us to die!
- As sinners, we also will never be justified on our own because we will fail to be perfect.
- Our works will not justify us!
- o Romans 3:20
- o Galatians 3:11
- Anyone judged by his or her own righteousness will be condemned to eternal separation.
- o vs (13) "according to their works"
 - Mentioned a second time!
- o vs (15) "not found written in the Book of Life"
 - The basis of their judgment is their works.
 - The Book of Life affirms that they never trusted Christ as Savior and Lord.
- *Perhaps they are judged by their works and then cry out what Matthew 7:22 says "Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in your name, cast out demons in your name, and done many wonders in Your name?"
- *Perhaps he shows them that their name is not in the Lamb's Book of Life and says to them "I never knew you, Depart from me, you who practice lawlessness."
- *There are two ways to be judged based upon your own righteousness or the righteousness of Christ!
- 3. The punishment for unbelievers will be separation and torment!
 - vs (13) "They were judged"
 - vs (14) "Then"
 - o The results of the judgment are being made known next.
 - vs (14) "death and Hades"
 - o Death here represents the bodies in the grave of the ground or the sea.
 - o "Hades" is their soul.
 - vs (14) cast into the lake of fire"
 - o There is a judge but no jury!
 - o There is a prosecution but no defense.
 - o There is a sentence but no appeal.
 - o There is no chance of a delayed sentence.
 - o There is no chance of parole.
 - o There is no universal salvation.
 - There is no 2nd chance.
 - o Only certain eternal punishment.

- vs (14) "Lake of Fire"
 - o This is the final Hell!
 - The Devil, the false prophet, the Antichrist, the armies of Satan and all unbelievers will end up here.
- vs (14) "second death"
 - o 1st death was spiritual separation from God.
 - o 2nd death is eternal separation from God!
 - o The first death was not necessarily eternal.
 - o Anyone who trusts Christ will no longer be separated.
 - They will not experience the 2nd death.
 - o All who reject Christ will and it will be too late then to change that.

"Gehenna" was the place where they burned things outside of Jerusalem. It is the term most frequently used for hell.

- It is used 12 times in the New Testament, 11 of those are by Jesus!
- Matthew 5:22 (see also Matthew 5:29-30).
- Matthew 10:28
- Matthew 23:33
- Mark 9:43-44 (see also vs 45-48).

- Satan is still telling this same lie!
- You will surely die, eternally separated in a place of fire and torment!
