## Impartation Devo

Day 1: Speaking Life Reading: James 3:1-12

Devotional: Our words have immense power - to build up or tear down, to give life or bring death. As we read James' vivid descriptions of the tongue, let's reflect on how we use our words. Do we speak life and encouragement to others, or do we let negativity and criticism flow freely? God calls us to be intentional with our speech, using it to bless others and glorify Him. Today, make a conscious effort to speak words of life, hope, and love to everyone you encounter. Ask God to help you tame your tongue and use it as an instrument of His grace.

Day 2: Christ In Us

Reading: Colossians 1:24-29

Devotional: The incredible truth of "Christ in us" is a recurring theme in Scripture. As believers, we have the living Christ dwelling within us through the Holy Spirit. This means we have access to His wisdom, power, and love at all times. Today, meditate on what it truly means to have Christ living in you. How does this change your perspective on your daily life and challenges? Ask God to help you tap into the resources He's placed within you, and to live from that place of divine indwelling.

Day 3: Transformation and Surrender

Reading: Romans 12:1-2

Devotional: God calls us to be transformed by the renewing of our minds, not conforming to the patterns of this world. This transformation happens as we surrender ourselves fully to Him. Reflect on areas of your life where you might be holding back from God. Are there thought patterns or behaviors that don't align with His will? Surrender these to Him today, asking for His transforming power to work in you. Remember, this is a continual process - we are always growing and changing as we walk with Christ.

Day 4: Impartation and Spiritual Gifts

Reading: Romans 1:11-12, 1 Thessalonians 2:8

Devotional: God has given each of us spiritual gifts to build up the body of Christ and further His kingdom. These gifts are meant to be shared and imparted to others. Consider the gifts God has given you - how are you using them to bless others and glorify Him? Paul speaks of imparting not just spiritual gifts, but also his very life to those he ministered to. How can you pour out your life in service to others today? Ask God to show you opportunities to use your gifts and impart His love to those around you.

Day 5: Living Undivided for God Reading: James 1:5-8, Matthew 6:24 Devotional: God calls us to live undivided lives, fully committed to Him. James warns against being double-minded, while Jesus teaches that we cannot serve two masters. Reflect on areas of your life where you might be trying to live with one foot in God's kingdom and one in the world. What would it look like to fully commit those areas to God? Ask Him for the wisdom and courage to live an undivided life, wholly devoted to Him. Remember, when we seek first His kingdom, everything else falls into place.
