

FROM BETRAYAL TO ENCOUNTER



1 CORINTHIANS 11:23-32

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For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, that the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread: And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped,

1 Corinthians 11:23-32

saying, this cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me. For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come. Wherefore whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread,

1 Corinthians 11:23-32

and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep. For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged. But when we are judged, we are chastened of the Lord, that we should not be condemned with the world."

“The Lord Jesus, on the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread...”

- Jesus meets us in the middle of Broken Moments.

- God does His Deepest Work in Uncomfortable Places.

- The Holy Spirit does not avoid broken places. He invades them.

“And when He had given thanks, He broke it...”

- **Whatever is broken in your life is not wasted in God's Hands.**

“Take... Eat; This is My Body...”

- God is not calling you to Observe from a Distance; He is calling you to Participate.

“For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death till He comes.”

- This is more than just reflection; it is a Declaration; Proclaiming that the Cross Still Works, the Blood Still Saves, the Enemy is Still Defeated... and Jesus is Still Coming Again.
