### **Getting Started**

Group Discussion #1: Pastor Rob said in his Sunday morning message: "When we make that choice, that commitment, (to follow Jesus) our lives take a turn from going the direction that everyone else in the world is going, to going the complete opposite direction – the direction of following Jesus and obeying His commands, living the way he wants us to live." How did your life change after you came to faith in Christ for salvation?

Group Discussion #2. Here's another quote from the morning message: "The call to follow Jesus is a call to live like Him and in obedience to His commands which automatically places us in an upstream kind of living. So when we live the way Jesus wants us to live, we stand out." Did you experience this after you were saved? How?

Group Discussion #3. Also from the message: "Christ wants us to stick out. This is how people in the world will know that we are His followers. This is what will draw those who don't know Christ to us in search of truth. When we live green-fish lives against the current of gray-fish lives and couple that with lifestyles of doing good works for the benefit of others in the name of Jesus, we will then have the credibility and a platform to share

the gospel with others in a way that will make following Jesus Christ a compelling option to those who need Jesus. And this is how we reach our area for Jesus Christ." Now read 1 Peter 2:9-12.
