

Introduction

The book of Daniel can be easily divided into two major sections: Chapters 1-6 are historical, and Chapters 7-12 are prophetic. Since the last half of the book is entirely prophetic in nature, Daniel did not put it in chronological order. He did however help us by beginning each chapter with a historical reference that helps us know when the events took place. The visions found in the last half of the book all took place after King Nebuchadnezzar was dead.

Getting Started

Group Discussion: Have you ever had to testify in court? If so, describe your experience.

Digging Deeper

- 1. On Sunday morning we dissected Daniel chapter 7. What questions does this chapter raise in your mind? (Discuss as a group)
- 2. Describe the pertinent details surrounding Daniel's vision of God the Father as the "Ancient of Days". How is God portrayed in this passage?
- 3. How did Daniel discover the meaning of these visions? Were the visions more comforting or more troubling? Why?
- 4. Let's do a cross reference to our text. Read Revelation chapter 13 together. What does John's vision add to the revelation from Daniel's vision that the "same horn was making war against the saints" (vs. 21)?
 - In his description of Antichrist (the leader of Daniel's fourth beast or empire), Revelation uses the imagery of a leopard, bear, and lion (which is how Daniel described his first three beasts). Why do you think this is so?
- 5. Re-read Daniel 2:20-22. What truths does this prayer of praise contain for those who might be tempted to worry about the future?
- 6. Read Daniel 7:15 & 28. In each verse Daniel mentions how much this vision impacted him. On a scale of 1-10 (1=low, 10=high), how troubled are you by the direction of our culture, our nation? What can we do about it and what should we do in light of it on a daily basis?
- 7. In the final analysis, what is the main thing God is trying to show us through this amazing dream He gave to Daniel?

Wrapping Up

Review the application points from the Sunday morning study of Daniel 7. Which one most speaks to your heart as you think about this passage of Scripture in Daniel? What's the application for you?
