1 Thessalonians 5:21-22

#### What is Discernment?

"Discernment is the ability to understand, interpret and apply truth skillfully; to decide between truth and error, right and wrong." ~ John MacArthur

"Biblical Discernment is the ability to judge or distinguish between two things using the wisdom of God's Word." ~ Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth

	ng Deeper:	
1.	One of the verses we touched on Sunday was Psalm 119:66, "Teach me good judgment and	
	discernment, for I rely on your commands." The word discernment here means "to taste". It's the	
	ability to make discriminating judgments, to distinguish between and to recognize the moral	
	implications of different situations, groups and individuals.  When we taste any or various kinds of food, what are we trying to discern?	
	What is the psalmist in this verse asking God to do?	
	What does this tell us about discernment?	
	What is it that most helps us in being discerning? Why?	
	What is the intentional commitment the psalmist makes in this verse?	
2.	Another verse we briefly looked at on Sunday was this one: "And I pray this: that your love will keep	
	on growing in knowledge and every kind of discernment, so that you may approve the things that are superior and may be pure and blameless in the day of Christ." Philippians 1:9-10	
	What are the two outcomes that Paul hoped would happen in the Philippian believers as a result of growing in love and discernment?	
	Why would it be important for them – and for us today – to possess these outcomes in our lives?	
3.	Turn to 1 Thessalonians 5 and read vs. 21.	
	The first step in practicing discernment is to The word means to examine,	
	to approve, to discern the worth of something. What are we test in this way and why is this	
	important?	

Where have you found it most important in your life to put this into practice? Why?		
The second step in practicing discernment is to This carrie		
the idea of embracing something. Like a mother embracing her baby against any and all harm, we		
are to embrace what is good according to the Word of God, including the Word of God itself. It		
means to love the truth with all our heart. Biblical discernment is the love of God's truth and the		
doctrines found in the truth of the Bible and all the good that is espoused in the Bible like a mother		
loves her baby and protects it.		
On a practical note, how do you believe that holding on to what is good would impact your own		
personal spiritual growth and health?		
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The third step in practicing discernment is to		
The thought behind the phrase "stay away" carries the idea of rejecting something, abstaining, avoiding, getting as far away from something that you can. Why do you believe it would be		
beneficial to your walk with Christ to "stay away from every kind of evil" as much as you possibly can?		
One of the verses we noted on Sunday was "abstain from sinful desires that wage war against the		
soul" 1 Peter 2:11b. When you read that verse, what is the idea it conveys in relation to the dangers of sin and why do you believe understanding this is so important?		

So there you have it! Every Christian is called by God live a discerning Christian life and we can if we follow God's step-by-step plan to: test all things, hold on to what is good, and stay away from every kind of evil. In the days we're living in, discernment is a critical spiritual discipline we all need to cultivate and even more so as move forward in God's plans for the future. We noted on Sunday 3 ways to process this cultivation of spiritual discernment:

- 1. Pray for discernment
- 2. Obey the truth (of the Word of God)
- 3. Depend on the Holy Spirit

- 4. Desire wisdom Read Proverbs 3:3-6
- 5. Follow discerning leaders Read 1 Corinthians 11:1
- 6. Study the Bible Read 2 Timothy 2:15
