Revelation Chapter One

Challenge #1; To live in the "now' for eternity's sake (Ephs.3:20).

Challenge #2: To become another *voice* for the kingdom (Matt.28:19-20).

Challenge #3: To strengthen our <u>resolve</u> to grow spiritually as we yield our lives to the power of the Holy Spirit (2 Peter 3:18).

DID YOU KNOW...

- Revelation is the <u>only</u> prophetical book in the New Testament (in contrast to seventeen books in the Old Testament).
- Revelation is the only book in all the Bible which begins by promising a special <u>blessing</u>
 on those who study it, and ends by promising a special <u>curse</u> on those who add or take
 away from it.
- Revelation was <u>written</u> by John the Apostle, who had already written four other New Testament books. They are: The Gospel of John, 1 John, 2 John, and 3 John.
- The author had previously reached farther **back** than any other Bible writer (Jn.1:1-30).
- In Revelation he reaches farther <u>forward</u> into eternity than any other writer (Rev.21, 22).

BIBLICAL COMPARISONS

- A. Revelation may be compared to the book of *Daniel*.
 - 1. Concerning the indestructible *Jewish* nation (Dan.3, 6; cf. Rev.120.
 - 2. Concerning the working of the <u>antichrist</u> (Dan.3:1-7; 7:7,8,24,25; 8:9-12,23,24,25; 9:27; 11:36-45; cf. Rev.13).
 - 3. Concerning the length of the *Tribulation* (Dan.9:24-27; cf. Rev.11:2; 12:6,14; 13:5).
- B. Revelation may be compared to the book of *Genesis*. In...
 - Genesis (1:10) He called the waters Sea; In Revelation (21:1) there is **no more sea**!
 - Genesis has Adam/Eve in the Garden of Eden reigning over the Earth (1:27-28);
 Revelation has the last Adam/Bride, in the city of God, reigning over all the universe.
 - Genesis God created the sun and moon, the day and night (Gen.1:5,16). In Revelation no night and no *need* for the sun (Rev. 22:5; 21:23).
 - Genesis the tree of life <u>restricted</u> (Gen.3:22); in Revelation unlimited access (Rev.22:2).

- Genesis there is a curse (Gen.3:17); In Revelation no more *curse* (Rev.22:3).
- Genesis Satan torments man (Gen.3:1).; Revelation Satan is tormented *forever* (Rev.20:10).
- Genesis the old earth punished through a flood (Gen.7:12); In Revelation the new earth is *purified* through a fire (2 Pet.3:6-12; Rev.21:1).
- Genesis man's earthly home by a river (Gen.2:10); in Revelation man's <u>eternal</u> is by a river (Rev.22:1).
- In Genesis the Patriarch Abraham goes to weep for Sarah (Gen.22:3); In Revelation the children of Abraham God <u>Himself</u> will dry every tear from their eyes (Rev.21:4).
- Genesis God destroys an earthly city from the sands *Gen.19).; In Revelation presents a heavenly city, new Jerusalem, from the **skies** (Rev.21:1).
- Genesis ends with <u>bones</u> in a coffin (Gen.50:1-3).; Revelation ends with all believers in a <u>resurrection body</u> (Rev.21:4).
