The Order of the Resurrections 1 Corinthians 15:23

[Maybe we will all live to be 100. And with any luck, we won't die in an embarrassing way like...]

- Overdosing on Rogaine.
- Mooning from the back of a speeding pickup—and falling out.
- Exploding in a pie-eating contest.
- Drowning in a bowl of cereal after taking too many shots of nighttime NyQuil.
- Being shot to death by a salad shooter (there was a carrot in the chamber, and he never saw it coming.
- Being hit by an ice-cream truck would be embarrassing, and quite sad. The last thing you would hear is that crazy, out-of-tune music fading, and a dozen kids screaming...as they chased after the truck.
- How about bleeding to death from a safety-scissors injury?
- Or suffocating in the ball pit at a chuck-E-cheese?
- No self respecting outdoorsmen would want to die in a hunting accident, falling asleep in a tree-top deer stand, only to tumble thirty-six feet to the forest floor and then be shot by your own gun as it goes off.
- Some have died accidentally by using a blow dryer while taking a shower, one guy choked to death in a Jell-O eating contest and another person died overdosing on suppositories, or dying while trying to see who can put the most marshmallows in his mouth; or snorting Sweet-n-Low to get high.

1. The resurrection and ascension of *Jesus Christ* (John 11:25; 1 Cor.15:3-23; Eph.1:19-20; Phil.3:10-11; Phil 3:20-21).

2. The resurrection of the *church* at the rapture (John 14:1-3; 1 Cor.15:51-57; 1 Thess.4:13-18; 1 John 3:2; Rev.20:6).

"There I was, driving down the freeway and all of a sudden the place went crazy...cars going in all directions...and not one of them had a driver. I mean it was wild! I think we've got an invasion from outer space!"

- 3. The resurrection of Tribulational *martyrs* and the *Old* Testament believers (Job 19:25-26; Isa.26:19-21; Dan.12:13; Heb.11:39-40; Rev.20:4).
- 4. The resurrection of the *millennial* saints (Revelation 20:5).
- 5. The resurrection and condemnation of all *unbelievers* (Revelation 20:13-15).

Closing: Three practical decisions to help us cope with life...

1. Choose to view life through God's eyes.

[Ask Him to transform your thinking. Let Him do what you cannot.]

[The biblical view of life after life is that heaven is for sinners and hell is for good people!]

[Hell swarms with people who were good, moral people but were too proud to drop their front.]

2. Surrender your expectations.

[Stop trying to change the universe to work the way you should think it should.]

[We choose to advance our own agenda and then try to blame everything but ourselves.]

We've done more finger pointing than a fat guy in a donut shop!

[Release your grip on what you want, no matter how good or right you think it is.]

[As you surrender your expectations, ask the Lord to show you His plan.]

3. Acknowledge the resurrection of Jesus Christ and stake your future upon it.

Death occurs on many levels and the resurrection of Jesus impacts them all!

For the believer, death is the beginning, the hyperlink to eternity!

Death without the life of Christ is the final 'fatal error'; the hard-drive crash with no hope of recovery.
