## **BEWARE OF ADVERSITY**

1 Corinthians 16:5-24

DEFINITION: Adversary - enemy, adversary, opponent. Application: The Greek word means a legal opponent such as an opponent in a lawsuit. It also means a common day-to-day opponent like a neighbor who opposes and stands as an enemy against us. The picture is that of the devil opposing us in every conceivable way.

- ⇒ It is the picture of Satan standing in a law court, standing as an adversary in the court of God accusing us before God.
- ⇒ It is the picture of Satan standing here on the earth, standing against us and doing all he can to trip us up and to defeat and destroy us.

"If you have no opposition in the place you serve, you're serving in the wrong place." ~ Dr. G. Campbell Morgan

- Paul was neither an optimist nor a pessimist; he was a *realist*.
- He saw both the *opportunities* and the *obstacles*.

One necessary principle for doing the Lord's work in the Lord's way is accepting opposition as a challenge rather than a hindrance." ~ Dr. John MacArthur

What adversaries did the apostle Paul face at Ephesus?

- Organized idolatry, centered in the famous temple of Diana.
- Ritual prostitution and sexual perversion not only were tolerated but were promoted in the name of religion.
- Jewish exorcists who went around claiming to cast out evil spirits in Jesus name.
- Paganism, idolatry, occultism, demonism, superstition, sexual vice, racism, and religious animosity.
- Verbal, spiritual, and physical abuse and warfare.

"So the Word of the Lord grew mightily and prevailed." ~ Acts 19:20

What final imperatives did Paul give to Corinth as they faced adversity?

- 1. Be *alert* spiritually.
- 2. Be *firm* in the faith.
- 3. Be *mature*.
- 4. Be **strong.**
- 5. Be *loving*.

- ⇒ In Paul's' closing greeting, we see reflected seven marks of Christian fellowship:
- 1. **Evangelism** (16:15a)
- 2. **Service** to each other (16:15b).
- ⇒ Devoted (tasso) means *addiction*.
- ⇒ Drug addiction has three primary characteristics:
  - A. It involves a strong *habit*, an overpowering desire and compulsion to take a given drug.
  - B. It involves a growing tolerance to the drug, so that, in order to maintain the desired *effect*, larger and larger doses must be taken.
  - C. The final characteristic is *dependence*, the state in which the addicted person must have the drug in order to function.
- ⇒ Sin never stays in its original form; neither does *spiritual* growth!
- 3. **Submission** (16:16).
- 4. *Companionship* (16:17-18a).
- 5. *Respect* (16:18b).
- 6. *Hospitality* (16:19-20a).
- 7. *Affection* 16:20b).

What adversaries are you facing today that would keep you from Christ and a growing addiction to serving him?
