The Lighting of Candles

One: We light five candles tonight in anticipation of the coming of Christ! We light one for our pain, one for our losses, one for our memories, one for our faith and hope and one for the disasters and wars of this world.

One: The First Candle we light to redeem the pain of loss; the loss of relationships, the loss of jobs, the loss of health...loss. We pause to gather up the pain of the past. We offer it to God, asking that from God's hands we may receive the gift of peace.

All: Refresh, restore, renew us, O God, and lead us into your future.

One: The Second Candle we light to remember those whom we have loved and lost. We pause to remember their names, their faces, their voices, and the memories that bind them to us in this season.

All: May God's eternal love surround them.

One: The Third Candle we light to remember ourselves this Christmastime. We pause and remember these past weeks, months and, for some of us, years of disbelief, anger, sadness, illness, fear. We remember the power of memories, the grief, the sadness, the hurts the pain of reflection on our own mortality. We remember hugs and handshakes of family and friends, all those who stood with us.

All: Let us remember that dawn defeats darkness--love diminishes fear.

One: The Fourth Candle we light to remember our faith and he gift of hope, which the Christmas story offers to us. We remember that God, who shares our life, promises us a place and time of no more pain and suffering.

All: Let us remember the One who shows the way, who brings the truth, and who bears the light—who goes with us into our tomorrows.

One: The Fifth Candle we light is for all impacted by the pandemic, by disasters, by tragedy, by gun violence, and by war. Bring your eternal peace to all places and help us reconcile with you and with one another. O God, we long for peace! Come, Lord Jesus, Come!

All: Indeed, we long for peace, O God! Amen.
