

OUR MISSION:






Today is Ash Wednesday and we begin the 40-day season of Lent, mirroring the forty days that Jesus spent in the wilderness in temptation. Lent is an ancient word that means "spring" and is a time of preparation, fasting, prayer, and devotion as we move on a journey toward Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter. We receive the ashes on our forehead or hand as a sign of repentance, confession, and our own mortality. Our sermon series for Lent is *I AM: Encountering*



Jesus in the Gospel of John. Based on the bookby Rev. Rob Fuquay, The God We Can Know, we will hear and study the "I AM" statements of Jesus recorded in the book of John. From "I am the Good Shepherd" to "I am the Bread of Life," we will deepen our commitment to Christ in this sacred journey together.
