Acts 8:26-39

:26

Desert Road, barren, no water

:27

Barren man; rejection at the Temple due to being a Gentile and having a deformity. No Eunuchs May approach

:28

He doesn't hold it against God that he may have been mistreated

:29

Personhood of the Spirit; He is speaking

:30

Heard him reading> They would mostly read aloud due to the style of writing they were reading

:31

We all need guidance through the Scriptures

:32

We are to note where he was reading

:33

2 significant points:

- 1. He will be mistreated
- 2. He will die childless

:34

Key question: Solves even modern controversies about Isaiah

:35

Philip gave the Eunuch a "Seeing Christ in All of Scripture" class. This answer solves the controversies

:36

Water signifies the end of barrenness.

This water was not there on his original trip

Why state this question negatively?

Belief removes all the impediments of the law
