

GETTING STARTED

What was your favorite hideout as a kid?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What was the point of Elijah's "cloak-throw" onto Elisha's shoulders (v.19)?
- 2. What kind of emotions do you think Elisha experienced when this happened to him?
- 3. Share about a time when you stepped forward and obeyed God, even if you didn't understand fully what it all meant. What happened?
- 4. Why did Elisha slaughter the oxen and burn his plow? What did it mean?
- 5. How easy or difficult has it been for you to step into a new chapter in life (new job, empty-nesting, retirement, school, etc)?
- 6. Elisha became Elijah's attendant. How are you developing the leadership who will eventually replace you?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

PRAYER: Father, thank you for the leaders who show us the way. Give us courage when you ask us to step into a new chapter. Help us to follow you and be obedient to your call. Help us to 'let go' of the things that are needed. In Jesus' name, we pray, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read I Kings 19:19-21 and 2 Kings 2:1-14. Why did Elisha ask for a "double portion" of Elijah's spirit? (v.9) What happened afterward? In whose shoes would you like to spend a day walking and talking? What would you hope to learn?

"So Elijah went and found Elisha son of Shaphat plowing a field. There were twelve teams of oxen in the field, and Elisha was plowing with the twelfth team. Elijah went over to him and threw his cloak across his shoulders and then walked away. Elisha left the oxen standing there, ran after Elijah, and said to him, 'First let me go and kiss my father and mother good-bye, and then I will go with you!' Elijah replied, 'Go back, but think about what I have done to you.' So Elisha returned to his oxen and slaughtered them. He used the wood from the plow to build a fire to roast their flesh. He passed around the meat to others in the town, and all ate. Then he went with Elijah as his assistant.
