

GETTING STARTED

What's something you <u>want</u> that you don't need? What's something you <u>have</u> that you don't need?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Read Ecclesiastes 4:6. How would you describe some specific examples of "chasing after the wind?"
- 2. Have you ever believed an item, an amount of money, or a job would make you happy? How did that pan out?
- 3. Read Ecclesiastes 4:7-12. How easy it is for you to allow someone to help you? Or, to let someone know that you need help? Where would you be spiritually were it not for the help of others?
- 4. Read I Timothy 6:17-19. Which part of these commands are you doing well at? Which part do you want to grow in?
- 5. What does "one handful living" mean to you? How do you find peace and meaning during the Advent/Christmas season?
- 6. Share some specific examples in your life of how you can "Travel Light": pass items on, buy less, and give more. What would help you to do this?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

<u>PRAYER</u>: Jesus, you are so much more than we could ever want or need. You are more than enough. We need your strength to let go of all the extras we try to pack into our lives. Show us the first step to a one-handful life, full of your presence and peace. In Jesus' name, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read Matthew 19:16-24. What appears to be this young man's view on how one obtains eternal life? Had the man truly loved his neighbor? How do you know? What have you given up to follow Jesus? How is your life different as a result?

"Better one handful with tranquility than two handfuls with toil and chasing after the wind." Fcc. 4:6
