

## **GETTING STARTED**

What is the pet peeve that most frequently causes you to become frustrated with people?

#### **REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. "You can't control what people do, but you can control how you respond." How does this statement affect how you relate to others?
- 2. Read Hebrews 12:14-15. When has bitterness been a temptation in your life? What are some bitter roots you could take care of before they grow up to cause trouble?
- 3. Do you know someone who could be bitter but isn't? How do you think he/ she does it? How challenging is compassion and forgiveness when someone has hurt you?
- 4. "If you can't let go of the past, you can't embrace the future." What are some of the most important components to learning from or healing from your past to move forward?
- 5. Think about your past self and your present self. Does it seem like two totally different people, a little different, or about the same? How have you grown and changed through the years? How has God's grace been a part of that journey?
- 6. How can you use compassion and forgiveness (if needed) to bring your family closer when you gather for the holidays?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

**PRAYER:** Lord Jesus, thank you for saving us from our past so we can step into our future. Show us any roots of bitterness in our lives. Give us strength to show compassion and forgiveness to people who have hurt us. In the name of Christ, Amen.

**GOING DEEPER:** Read Ephesians 4:17-5:2. Of all the commands given here for Christian living, which seems to be the major command God is challenging you with in your life? Where do you feel you are making progress in your Christian life?
