### **GETTING STARTED**

What teacher, coach, or other person taught you a lot about attitude and character?

### **REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. What was the original intent of 'eye for eye' and 'tooth for tooth'? (Ex.21:24; Lev.24:17-20)
- 2. What qualities does Jesus say should replace desires for revenge?
- 3. What characteristic is to distinguish a Christian from a non-Christian? What actions demonstrate this characteristic? (v.43-47)
- 4. What is your initial reaction to vs.48? What challenge is Jesus presenting to you?
- 5. Since turning your life over to Jesus, what effect has this had on your ability to love others—even those who hurt you?
- 6. When it comes to making things right with others, who comes to mind? What steps could you take this week to reconcile with that person?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

**PRAYER:** Lord Jesus, thank you for these powerful examples of what it means to love those who hurt us. Help us to forgive when needed, to stand up when needed, to do all things with respect and love. You give us this third way to love. Help us to do it well. In the name of Christ, we pray, Amen.

**GOING DEEPER:** Read Matthew 5:38-48. What is Jesus' main point in this section? How are Christians called to live differently than others around us? Think of an example of a time when it was a real struggle for you to love someone because he/she hurt you. How did you get through it? Offer your thanks to God
