Big Idea:

COMMUNICATE CLEARLY WITH LOVE

GETTING STARTED

What was one of your favorite songs when you were a teenager? What did the lyrics say?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. In Proverbs 10:7-13, what is the connection between those who are "wise" and the words that they use?
- 2. In the passage from I Cor. 13, what does Paul say love is? What does Paul say love is not? How does this compare to love as defined in our culture?
- 3. How do words and the tone of your words communicate love in your family?
- 4. "Communicate clearly with love." What are some practical, everyday strategies that you have found helpful in communicating with the ones closest to you?
- 5. Look at the descriptions of perfect love in vs. 4-8 below. In which of these areas are you strongest? In which one are you the weakest?
- 6. What is one way that you can work to improve communication with your spouse and/or children over the next two weeks?
- 7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

PRAYER: Jesus, you are the ultimate example of perfect love and using words to encourage those closest to you. May we follow your example and communicate clearly with love to those in our family. Help us to think about the power of our words this week. In the name of Christ, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read Proverbs chapter 10. These are short, wise statements, often using picturesque language to make a point. Which proverbs stand out to you in his chapter? Why? What do you see here that relates to hard work? What is the reward? What is the opposite of hard work? What can you learn here?
