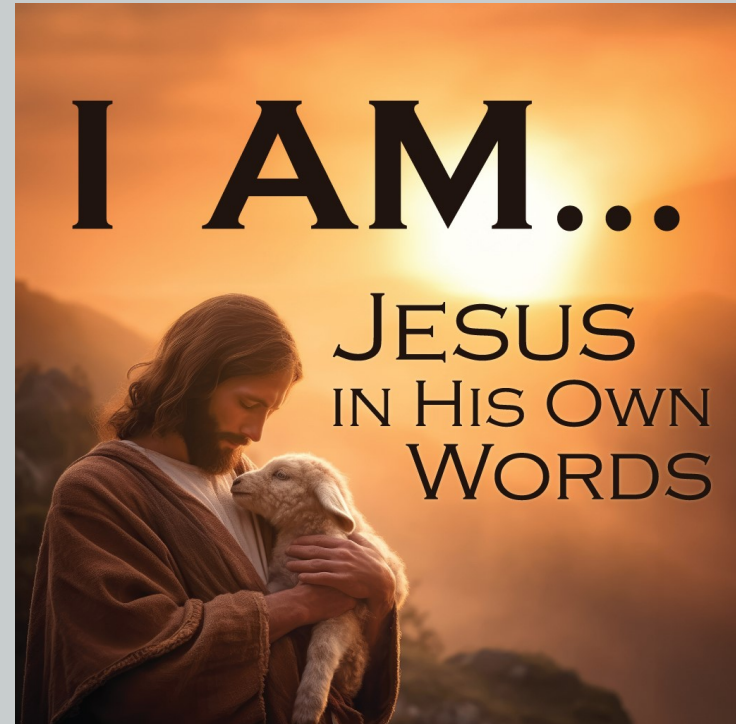

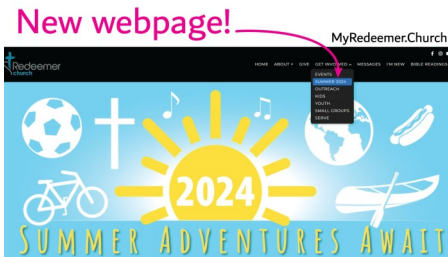




Daily Readings



JESUS
IN HIS OWN
WORDS

MESSAGE: I AM... THE BREAD OF LIFE Feb. 18, 2024
 Text: John 6:25-29; 35-40 Pew Bible page: 887

BIG IDEA: JESUS AS THE BREAD OF LIFE REPRESENTS DELIVERANCE AND SUSTENANCE.

“Jesus replied, ‘I tell you the truth, you want to be with me because I fed you, not because you understood the miraculous signs. But don’t be so concerned about perishable things like food. Spend your energy seeking the eternal life that the Son of Man can give you.’”

John 6: 26-27 (NLT)

“Jesus replied, ‘I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry again. Whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. But you haven’t believed in me even though you have seen me. For I have come down from heaven to do the will of God who sent me.’”

John 6: 35-36, 38 (NLT)

MY NOTES:

GETTING STARTED

What is your favorite kind of bread? What has been your experience with fresh baked bread?

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What does the crowd ask Jesus to do in order that they can believe in him? (v.30-31)
2. How does Jesus use their interest in food to illustrate what he wants them to understand? (v.32-40)
3. What are the similarities and differences between manna (Ex. 16) and the “bread of life” (v.35)? How does Jesus make his point by describing himself as “the bread of life?”
4. “Jesus as the bread of life represents deliverance and sustenance.” Share a time in your life when Jesus delivered you from something or sustained you in some way.
5. What are your earliest memories of taking communion? What does Jesus mean by “eating his flesh” and “drinking his blood?” (v.53-58) What does the bread and juice mean to you?
6. If someone asked you, “How do you hunger and thirst after Jesus,” how would you respond? What does Jesus as the Bread of Life mean to you?
7. What are the prayer requests on your mind and heart today?

PRAYER: Lord Jesus, thank you for being our Bread of Life, the One who delivers us and the One who sustains us. Help us to hunger after you, for you are the One who fills our hearts. Thank you for providing for us. In Jesus’ name, we pray, Amen.

GOING DEEPER: Read John 6:22-59. What is Jesus trying to help the disciples to understand? How is the bread Jesus offers even greater than that of Moses (v.32,49)? What is the main reason you follow Jesus?
